REMARKS.

CHRISTCHURCH.

Bright, almost cloudless, weather prevailed during the first fortnight of March; in general very warm, and exceedingly hot and oppressive on the 8th, 9th, and 10th, when the shaded thermometer rose 85°·0, 84°·8, and 78°·0 respectively. At 10.30 P.M., on the 15th, a south-west gale began, accompanied with very heavy rain, and at first with hail and lightning. The storm of

wind and rain continued until the forenoon of the 17th. During the 24 hours ending 9.30 A.M. on the 17th, 2.172 inches of rain were collected; the velocity of the wind in the same time was 470 miles:—these are the extremes of wind and rain in 24 hours yet registered at the station. In the night preceding the 16th a further quantity of rain, equal to 1.245 inches, fell, making a total of 3.417 inches in 35 hours. From

the 17th to the close of the month the weather was cool and very pleasant, with showers of rain on the 19th and 25th. One night (the 14th) was slightly frosty. The mean temperature of the month, 59° , was nearly three degrees above the average; the excess being entirely due to the warmer nights. Solar and terrestrial radiation were both considerably above, and the mean velocity of the wind below, the average. Mean direction of the wind, S. 66° E. Spontaneous evaporation, 4·721 inches.

Rainfall in Lyttelton, 4·071 inches on 11 days; greatest fall in one day, 2·135 inches on the 16th.

HOKITIKA.

Very fine weather prevailed also at the West Coast during the month of March. The rainfall, 4·10 inches, was only 0·29 inches more than on the East Coast. It rained heavily on the nights of the 5th and 9th, and on the afternoon of the 15th; nine other days were more or less showery. No gales of wind or thunderstorms occurred. Mean temperature, $59^{\circ}\cdot7$, was $0^{\circ}\cdot7$ higher than in Christchurch. Mean direction of the wind, N. 54° W. Total rainfall since January 1st, 16·18 inches on 40 days, against 38·15 on 51 days in the same period in 1866.

PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, entitled "The Education Ordinance, 1864," it is among other things enacted that whenever the Board of Education shall call by advertisement a public meeting of owners and occupiers of land and householders in any district, and such meeting shall declare by the votes of the majority of the persons present (being such owners and occupiers of land and householders as aforesaid), that they are willing that the said district be formed into an Educational District under the provisions of the said Ordinance, and shall declare their willingness to provide the proportion of the annual expenses of an Educational District, the Superintendent shall, as soon as conveniently may be, by Proclamation in the Provincial Government Gazette, declare such district to be an Educational District under the said Ordinance, and such district shall thereupon become an Educational District accordingly:

And Whereas at a meeting duly called as aforesaid, and held at the Schoolhouse on Mr Hiatt's section, on Tuesday the 26th day of March last, the owners and occupiers of land and householders in the District specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, did by the votes of the majority there present, declare that they were willing that the said District should be formed into an Educational District; and further declared their willingness to provide the proportion of the annual expenses of an Educational District as provided in the said Ordinance:

Now therefore I, WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the power in me vested by the said in part recited Ordinance, do hereby proclaim that the district specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, shall be an Educational District within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

SCHEDULE.

MOUNT GREY DOWNS DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point on the north-western side of the Upper Sefton Road, where it is intersected by the Stony Creek; thence north-easterly following the said road to the reserve for road and railway purposes; thence following the said reserve in a northerly direction to the road forming the north-eastern boundary of section 4599; thence westerly along that road, and northerly along the road on the eastern side of section 2500 to the River Kowai; thence westerly, following the southern bank of the said river to a point in line with the north-western boundary of section 10,149; thence south-westerly, following a straight line to the northernmost corner of the latter section, and onwards in the same direction along its north-western boundary and a line in continuation thereof to the Stony Creek before mentioned, and from thence returning along the same to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance enacted by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Canterbury, entitled "The Education Ordinance Amendment Ordinance 1865," it is among other things provided

that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury for the time being from time to time to change or alter the boundaries of any and of every Educational District proclaimed under the authority of "The Education Ordinance, 1864."

And whereas, on the Fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, the Saltwater Creek Educational District was proclaimed under the authority of the said Ordinance, the boundaries of which district it is desirable to alter:

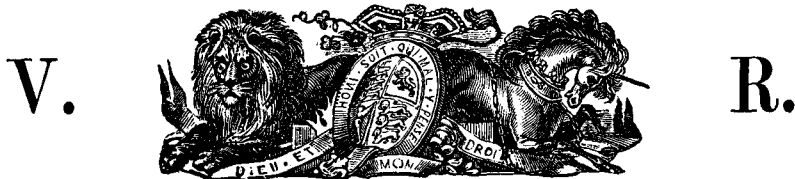
