PROCLAMATION

By His Honor FRANCIS EDWARD STEWART, Esq., Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, establishing a Public Pound at TIMUKA, in the Timaru District.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, entitled "The Trespass of Cattle Ordinance, Session XIV, No. 1," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent to cause Public Pounds to be erected and maintained within the said Province: Now, therefore, I, FRANCIS EDWARD STEWART, Deputy Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the provisions of the above recited Ordinance, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the place or enclosure erected upon Reserve No. 820, at Timuka, in the Timaru District, as shown in red on the maps of the Chief Surveyor, shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Pound within the meaning of the above recited Ordinance, from and after Monday, the Sixteenth day of September, 1867.
