PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, establishing a Public Pound in the Town of Hokitika.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, entitled "The Trespass of Cattle Ordinance, Session XIV, No. 1," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent to cause Public Pounds to be erected and maintained within the said Province:

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the provisions of the above recited Ordinance, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the place or enclosure erected upon Reserve No. 476, in the Town of Hokitika, being seventy-two feet square, and fronting on the sea beach, shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Pound within the meaning of the above recited Ordinance, from and after the First day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.
