IMMIGRATION COMMISSION.

SHIP "GLENMARK."

THE Commissioners report that every part of the vessel was cleanly, comfortable, and orderly. The Immigrants expressed every satisfaction with the provisions, and with the care and attention they had received.

The Master, Surgeon, and Officers are recommended for full gratuities.

The Commissioners have again to complain of the mixture of classes in the compartments which should be allotted to Immigrants alone. This in the married compartment had caused quarrelling between immigrants and passengers, in one case leading to a breach of the peace, which has had to be referred to the Magistrate's Court here.

In the single women's compartment a portion were indulged with enclosed berths, and in consequence refused to take their share of duty in cleaning, &c.

The Commissioners are informed that there was no difference in the payment made by these Immigrants.

The distilling apparatus (Graveley's) had worked well throughout the voyage, and appeared to be under the management of a skilful engineer.
