PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, entitled "The Education Ordinance, 1864," it is among other things enacted that whenever the Board of Education shall call by advertisement a public meeting of owners and occupiers of land and householders in any district, and such meeting shall declare by the votes of the majority of the persons present (being such owners and occupiers of land and householders as aforesaid), that they are willing that the said district be formed into an Educational District under the provisions of the said Ordinance, and shall declare their willingness to provide the proportion of the annual expenses of an Educational District, the Superintendent shall, as soon as conveniently may be, by Proclamation in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, declare such district to be an Educational District under the said Ordinance, and such district shall thereupon become an Educational District accordingly:

And Whereas at a meeting duly called as aforesaid, and held at the cottage lately occupied by Mr. Dyer, Governor's Bay, on Monday, the 30th day of December last, the owners and occupiers of land and householders in the District specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, did by the votes of the majority there present, declare that they were willing that the said District

should be formed into an Educational District; and further declare their willingness to provide the proportion of the annual expenses of an Educational District as provided in the said Ordinance:

Now therefore I, WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the power in me vested by the said in part recited Ordinance, do hereby proclaim that the district specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, shall be an Educational District within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

GOVERNOR'S BAY NORTH EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Now therefore I, WILLIAM SEFTON MOORHOUSE, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the power in me vested by the said in part recited Ordinance, do hereby proclaim that the district specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed shall be an Educational District within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

SCHEDULE.

FLAXTON EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of the Eyreton District touches the right bank of the River Waimakariri (such point being the south-eastern

corner of section 3768); thence following north-easterly along that bank to Boys' Rangiora Direct Road; thence north-westerly along that road to the north-western boundary of section 4295; thence along that boundary round the eastern boundary of section 8194; thence along the eastern and north-eastern boundaries of section 10,090, and along the north-eastern boundary of section 10,089 to the road to the east of sections 4146 and 2229; thence following north-easterly along that road to the River Cam, following that river north-westerly to Young's Road; thence westerly along this latter road to its junction with the Boys' Rangiora Direct Road, following south-easterly along this latter road to its junction with the Ashley and Kaiapoi Road; thence north-westerly along this latter road to the north-east corner of section 1579; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of this latter section, and westerly along its southern boundary, and northerly along the road on its western boundary to its junction with the road on the north of section 6610; thence westerly along this latter road, and southerly along the same road, where it forms the western boundary of the same section, and following southerly the eastern boundary of section 6592 (such boundary being the eastern boundary of the Fernside District) to the main Drain; thence north-westerly along the drain to the road between sections 4102 and 4101; thence south-westerly along that road to the north-western corner of section 6191; thence along the western boundaries of sections 6196, 3980, and 7229, to the road on the south-east boundary of this latter section; thence south-westerly along this latter road to the northern boundary of the Eyreton District, and thence easterly along that boundary to the starting point.

SCHEDULE.

LOBURN EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the north by a line drawn from the north-east corner of Section 10706 to the north-east corner of Section 9018, and thence in a straight line to the Grey River; on the west by the Grey River to its junction with the Okuku River, and by the latter river to its junction with the Ashley River; on the south by the Ashley River to its junction with the Makerikeri River; and on the east following northwards up the western boundary of the Ashley Bank District, and easterly along its northern boundary to Trig Pole 3A, and from thence in a straight line to the starting point.

HIS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that he has made the following Reserves, upon the recommendation of the Provincial Council, viz :—

No. 198, in red.—Three thousand five hundred and fifty-six acres (more or less), situate in the Waipara District, being bounded on the north and east by the River Hurunui, on the south by the River Waitohi, and on the west by a due north and south line passing through the trigonometrical

station forming the eastern extremity of the base line—For a quarantine ground for sheep.

No. 400, in red.—Twenty acres (more or less), situate in the Rakaiia District, commencing at a point on the western side of the reserve for the Southern line of Railway, immediately opposite the peg, marked twenty nine miles, ten chains; thence following a straight line, at a right angle with the said reserve, in a north-westerly direction, a distance of five chains; thence at a right angle, north-easterly, a distance of forty chains; thence again at a right angle, south-easterly, to the South Road; thence south-westerly along the said road to the reserve above-mentioned; and from thence, returning along the same to the commencing point—For Railway Station.

No. 408, in red.—One thousand acres, (more or less), situate at the confluence of the rivers Wilberforce and Harper, commencing at a point on the southern bank of the Wilberforce, the same being eighty chains distant from the same, following the said bank and a line in continuation of the same in a south-easterly direction, a distance of one hundred and twenty chains, and extending back south-westerly a distance of about eighty chains, in a rectangular block, including the river-bed—For the uses of the Provincial Government, and particularly for a Ferry, Road, and Railway.

No. 412, in red.—Sixty-five acres (more or less), situate in the Malvern District, bounded on the northward by the Waimakariri; on the eastward by sections 3110 and 3111; and on the westward by a line being in continuation of the eastern side of the Gorge-hill Road, subject to P. R. 29—For the uses of the Provincial Government, and particularly for a Road and Railway.

No. 413, in red.—All that tract of land, being three chains wide, extending from the southern boundary of section 3625, and running along the eastern side of the Gorge-hill Road, and branching therefrom to the right and left, following curves of forty chains radius to the Coal Tramway Reserve—For the uses of the Provincial Government, and particularly for a Road and Railway.

No. 435, in red.—All that tract of land, three chains wide, situate in the Malvern District, the centre line of the same commencing at a point on the Coal Tramway Reserve, being about ninety-six chains south-east of the intersection of the said Reserve by the Dalethorpe and Kowai

Road; thence north-westerly, following a curve of forty chains radius a distance of about forty chains; thence north-easterly, following a straight line a distance of ninety chains; thence northerly, following a curve of eighty chains radius to the foot of the high bank or terrace forming the north-eastern boundary of Section 5177, save and except the freehold land purchased to date—For the uses of the Provincial Government, and particularly for a Railway.

No. 457, in red.—All the tract of land, three chains wide, running from the Coal Tramway Reserve to the Dalethorpe and Kowai Road, the northern boundary being south of, and parallel to, and twenty chains distant from, the Little Racecourse Hill and Kowai Road—For the uses of the Provincial Government, and particularly for a Railway.

No. 702, in red.—Nine hundred and thirty acres (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District, being the old river-bed, bounded on the east by the road west of Section No. 3201, on the west by Reserve in red, No. 325, and Bealey Road, and on the northward by the high bank of the old river-bed forming the southern boundary line of Sections 2919, 2603, 2552, 2342, 2343, on the southward by the high bank forming the northern boundary of Sections Nos. 6099, 4911, 4910, 4842, 4634, 4069, and 2861; subject, nevertheless, to Reserves Nos. 325 and 326 (in red), and to Section 8005—For a rifle range.

No. 807, in red.—Two hundred acres (more or less), bounded on the north by the road forming the northern boundary of sections Nos. 4538 and 4539, and a line in continuation of the southern side thereof; on the east by the road reserved along high-water mark; on the south by the northern boundary of sections 10,695 and 10,929, and a line extending eastward and westward in continuation of that boundary; and on the west by the aforesaid section No. 4539, for a distance of about twenty-three chains—For a rifle range.

No. 819, in red.—Five acres (more or less), situate in the Timaru District, bounded on the north-east by the Geraldine Road, on the westward by the river Waihi, on the eastward by the stream forming the western boundary of section 4929, and on the south-west by a line parallel to the road before mentioned, so as to include the above quantity, subject to a road—For a public pond.

No. 820, in red.—Ten acres (more or less), situate in the Timaru district, bounded on the westward by the high bank of the Temuka, on the northward by section 2429, on the eastward by section 3132, and on the southward by the road forming the southern boundary of the last-mentioned section—For public purposes.

No. 857, in red.—Five acres (more or less), situate in the Town of Arowhenua, being bounded on the southward by High Street, on the northward by the Taumatakahu Creek, on the westward by a line in continuation of the western boundary of section 3154, and on the eastward by a line at right angles to the aforesaid street, so as to include the above quantity—For a public cemetery.

No. 865, in red, Twenty acres (more or less) situate in the Ashley District, bounded on the southward by the road forming the southern boundary of section 9692, and extending back northerly a distance on the average of twenty chains; the eastern boundary being five chains west of and parallel to the western boundary of the section above mentioned—For a gravel pit.

No. 866, in red.—Three hundred and twenty acres (more or less), situate in the Waitangi District, commencing at a point on the northern side of the deep channel of the Waitangi River, the same being in continuation of Buckley's fence, running easterly along the said River, a distance of eighty-five chains, and extending back northerly forty chains, in a rectangular block, the western boundary being the fence before mentioned—Subject also to Section 3240, and to the Road and Railway Reserves—For the purposes of a ferry.

No. 867, in red.—One hundred acres (more or less), situate in the Ashley District, being the bed of the River Kowai, from the sea on the east to a line drawn northerly in continuation of the western boundary of section No. 4971 on the west—For a rifle range.

No. 871, in red.—Six acres (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District; bounded on the north-westward by the Reserve for the Southern line of Railway, on the north-eastward by section 7416, on the south-eastward by the South Road, and on the south-westward by the road forming the north-eastern boundary of section 6363—For a gravel pit.
