**H**IS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that he has made the following Reserves temporarily, under the 19th clause of the Waste Lands Regulations, for Educational purposes, viz. :—

No. 396, in red.—Forty-two acres (more or less), situate in the Mandeville District, bounded on the northward by the Rangiora Main Drain, on the westward by section 7654, and on the eastward by section 4298.

No. 397, in red.—Seven hundred and fifty-nine acres (more or less), situate in the Mandeville District, commencing at a point on the Oxford and Ohoka Road, the same being the south-western corner of section 8117,

following westerly along the said road to the eastern boundary of section 3816; thence northerly along the eastern boundary line of sections 3816, 4281, and 4372; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the last-mentioned section, to the south-eastern corner of section 6254, following northerly along the eastern boundary thereof to I.P.R.D. on Run No. 3; thence easterly, following along the southern boundary line of the said pre-emptive, and of 3809, and a line in continuation of the same to the north-western corner of section 5000; thence southerly along the western boundary of that section, a distance of nine chains, ninety links; thence easterly along the southern boundary line of sections 5000 and 4999, to the north-western corner of

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- the aforesaid section, 8117; and from thence returning along the western boundary thereof to the commencing point, subject to the road forming the western boundary of section 5000.
- No. 398 (in red).—Ninety-seven acres (more or less), situate in the Oxford district, commencing at a point on the road, the same being the north-eastern corner of section 5869, following southerly and westerly along the eastern and southern boundaries of that section to the road forming its western boundary; thence southerly, following that road a distance of five chains, thence easterly following the northern boundary of section 6375 to the road on the western boundary of section 3879, thence north-easterly following that road to the road first mentioned, and from thence returning along the same to the commencing point, save and except section No. 6611.
- No. 399 (in red).—Seventy acres (more or less), situate in the Oxford District, commencing at a point on the road, the same being the south-west corner of reserve No. 356 (in red); thence north-easterly and south-easterly, following the north-western and north-eastern boundary of the said reserve to the road forming its south-eastern boundary; thence north-easterly, following the latter road to the road forming the south-western boundary of section 8816; thence north-westerly, following that road to the road being the eastern boundary of section 5100; thence southerly, following the last-mentioned road to the one first referred to, and from thence returning along the same to the commencing point.
- No. 916 (in red).—Two hundred acres (more or less), situate in the Rakaia District, having 50 chains frontage to the road, forming the southern boundary of section 4788, and extending southerly 40 chains in a rectangular block, west of and adjoining section 12,522.
- No. 917 (in red).—One hundred and fifty-nine acres (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District, commencing at a point on the Weedon and Ross road, the same being the westernmost corner of Section 12477, thence north-westerly following the said road to the southernmost corner of Section 9915, thence north-easterly and north-westerly following the south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of that section, distances respectively of 12 chains 50 links and 37 chains 89 links to Bealey's road, thence north-easterly, following the latter road to Sections 12487 and 12488; thence south-easterly following the south-western boundary of those sections, and a line in continuation thereof, a distance of 40 chains 56 links, and from thence returning along the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of the before-mentioned section 12477, to the commencing point.
- No. 918, in red.—One hundred acres, (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District, commencing at a point on Bealey's Road, the same being the north-west corner of section 6860; thence southerly, following the western boundary of that section a distance of forty chains; thence south-westerly, following a straight line to the north-eastern boundary of section 10276, which it meets at a right angle; thence north-westerly, following the north-eastern boundary line of sections 10276, 10878, 12368, 12369, and 12384, to I.P.R.A. on Run No. 37A; thence northerly and westerly, following the eastern and northern boundaries of the said I.P.R. to the north-western corner thereof; thence following a line in continuation of the western boundary of the same pre-emptive right to the road above mentioned; and from thence returning along the same to the commencing point.
- No. 919, in red.—One hundred and forty acres (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District, bounded on the southward by Bealey's Road and section 11582; on the westward by that section and the continuation of the road forming its western boundary; on the eastward by section 10917; and on the northward by the high bank of the old river bed.
- No. 920, in red.—Thirty-one acres (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District, bounded on the eastward by sections 10921 and 9069; on the northward by section 11330, and also the road forming the northern boundary of the first-mentioned section; on the westward by the aforesaid section 11330 and the road forming its western boundary; and on the southward by section 12205.
- No. 921, in red.—Sixty-eight acres (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District, having frontage to the road forming the southern boundary of section 4849, and extending northerly forty chains in a rectangular block, being bounded on the eastward by the aforesaid section 4849, on the westward by section 9069, and partly on the northward by section 4866.
- No. 922, in red.—Thirty-six acres (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District, bounded on the eastward by section 10219, on the westward by section 9004, on the northward by the road forming the northern boundary of those sections, and on the southward by sections 5640 and 6098.

- No. 923, in red. — Sixty-eight acres (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District, bounded on the westward by section 10921, on the northward by the road forming the northern boundary of that section, on the eastward by sections 10255 and 4866, on the southward by the latter section, and by section 9069 and Reserve No. 921 (in red).
- No. 924, in red.—Three hundred and fifty acres, (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District, commencing at a point on the road, the same being the northernmost corner of section 7375; thence south-westerly, following the northwest boundary of the said section, and a line in continuation thereof, a distance of 41 chains; thence south-easterly, following the road on the south-west boundary of the same section, a distance of about 31 chains; thence south-westerly at a right angle to the north-east corner of section 6417; following the northern boundary of that section, and of section 9677, a distance of 70 chains; thence north-easterly, following the south-east boundary of section 12281, a distance of 8 chains 32 links; thence following the north-eastern boundaries of sections 12281, 12477, and reserve No. 917 (in red), to the south-west corner of sections 12487 and 12488; thence following the southern and eastern boundaries of those sections to Bealey's road; thence north-easterly, following that road to the one first mentioned, and from thence returning along the same to the commencing point.—Subject to a road.
- No. 925, in red. — Thirty four acres, (more or less), situate in the Christchurch District, bounded on the south-eastward by section 7801, on the north-eastward by the road forming the north-eastern boundary of that section, and on the westward by the eastern boundary of I.P.R.G., on run No. 37a, and a line in continuation of the same.
- No. 926, in red. — One hundred and four acres, (more or less), situate in the Oxford District, bounded on the northward by the road forming the southern boundary of section 4286; on the westward by the road, being the western boundary of the same section; on the southward by the road on the northern boundary of section 7847, and on the eastward by sections 4525 and 7405.
- No. 927 in red. — Five hundred acres (more or less), situate in the Oxford District, bounded on the northward by the Harewood road, by Rangiora, and also by section No. 12,326, and reserve No. 362 (in red); on the westward by the aforesaid section 12,326, and by the road forming the western boundary of reserve No. 364 (in red); on the southward by the

road on the northern boundary of section 7847; and on the eastward by the first-mentioned section, and also by the road being the western boundary of section 4286. Subject to a road.

- No. 928 (in red).—Four hundred and ninety-eight acres (more or less), situate in the Oxford District, bounded on the south-westward by the Harewood road by Riccarton; on the south-eastward by the road forming the north-western boundary of section 8126; on the northward by sections Nos. 8933, 9230, 6189, 6074, and reserve 359 (in red); and on the westward by section 6139, and the road being the western boundary of the reserve before mentioned.

**H**IS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that he has made the following Reserves temporarily, under the 19th clause of the Waste Lands Regulations, viz. :—

- No. 288, in red.—One thousand two hundred and eighty acres (more or less), situate on the north bank of the Rakaia, bounded on the south by the Rakaia; on the east by the Ferry Reserve now held by Flowers; on the west by a line at right angles to the river; and on the north by a line parallel to and distant one mile from the river—For railway purposes.
- No. 317, in red.—All that tract of land, being a strip of land half a mile wide, as marked on the plan of the Railway Commissioners, and coloured green thereon, dated 6th February, 1864, extending from the thirty-first mile peg to Section No. 5800—For road, railway, and telegraph purposes.
- No. 318, in red.—All that tract of land, being half a mile wide, on each side of the present Railway Reserve, as marked on the plan of the Railway Commissioners, dated 6th February, 1864, extending from the northern bank of the Ashburton to the southern bank of the Orari—For road, railway, and telegraphic purposes.
- No. 349, in red.—All that tract of land, one mile wide, lying between the rivers Rangitata and Orari, the centre line of the same being a right line drawn from a point on the northern bank of the Rangitata aforesaid, one mile above McDonald's crossing, to a point on the western side of the south Railway Reserve, about thirty chains to the southward of trig. station 4 (save and accept the freehold land), as the same is more particularly delineated on the Map of the Chief Sur-

- veyor of the Province of Canterbury, setting out and describing the rural land in the Timaru District—For road, railway, and telegraphic purposes.
- No. 350, in red.—All that tract of land, one mile wide, lying between the Rivers Ashburton and Rangitata, the centre line of the same being a right line drawn from the south-western corner of section 4354 on the South road to a point on the northern bank of the Rangitata aforesaid, one mile above McDonald's crossing, save and except the freehold land, and the Reserve for Railway purposes, numbered 318, in red, as the same is more particularly delineated and described on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Canterbury, setting out and describing the runs between the Rivers Ashburton and Rangitata before mentioned—For road, railway, and telegraphic purposes.
- No. 389, in red.—All that tract of land, one mile wide, extending from the southern bank of the Orari to section No. 5961, being bound on the eastward by the South Road, and on the westward by a line eighty chains distant from and parallel to that road—For railway purposes.
- No. 406, in red.—One thousand acres (more or less), on either side of the Harper River, commencing at a point at the foot of the Sheep Range, on the southern side of the Lake Selfe Valley, the same being sixty chains east of the Harper; following westerly along the foot of the Sheep Range, and a line in continuation of the same, a distance of one hundred and sixty chains, and extending back northerly a distance of sixty chains, in a rectangular block, including the river bed of the Harper—For the uses of the Provincial Government, and particularly for a ferry, road, and railway.
- No. 407, in red.—Two thousand acres (more or less), situate in the river-bed of the Wilberforce, being bounded on the north-west by reserve in red No. 405, extending on either side of the fords, being a rectangular block, about sixty-eight chains from north to south, and about three hundred chains from east to west, including the river bed of the Wilberforce—For the uses of the Provincial Govern-
- ment, and particularly for a ferry, road, and railway.
- No. 740, in red.—All that track of land, two and a half chains wide, the centre line of which commences at a point marked A on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the province of Canterbury, setting out and describing the rural land in the Timaru district, and situated on the northern bank of the river Pareora, about thirty-five chains in a northerly direction from the confluence of a small stream with the said river; thence following the centre line before-mentioned, as indicated by a red line on the map above referred to, until it meets the road forming the south-west boundary of section 8299, at a point being about forty chains south-east of the south-western corner of that section; subject, nevertheless, to the freehold land purchased to date through which the reserve above described may pass—For a water-race, for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of Timaru with water from the river Pareora.
- No. 868, in red.—All that tract of land, three chains wide, commencing at the end of the present Railway Reserve through the Weka Pass across the Waikari Valley, thence passing east of Horsley Downs to the Gorge of the Hurunui, thence along the Valley of the Hurunui to Lake Sumner, a distance of about forty-and-a-half miles, subject to land purchased and finally reserved to date—For railway purposes.
- No. 869, in red.—All that tract of land, forty chains in width, commencing at the western end of Reserve No 868 in red; thence following along the southern shore of Lake Sumner and the slopes of the hills on the south side of Hurunui Valley to the summit of the dividing range, a distance of about twenty-two miles, subject to land purchased and finally reserved to date—For railway purposes.
- No. 915 in red—Three acres, three roods, more or less, situate in the Ellesmere District, bounded on the northward by Hart's road, on the south-eastward by section 7716, and on the south-westward by the Taumutu and Bridge's road—For a gravel pit.
