PROCLAMATION

By WILLIAM ROLLESTON, ESQUIRE, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the Fifteenth day of October, I, William Rolleston, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, did prorogue the Provincial Council till the Thirtieth day of November, and the said Provincial Council did stand prorogued accordingly :

No. 954, IN RED.

Kilmore Street—North side from Montreal Street to Antigua Street.

Kilmore Street—South side from Montreal Street to Antigua Street.

Worcester Street—South side from Latimer Square to the East Town Belt.

South Town Belt—North side from Colombo Street to Antigua Street.

South Town Belt—North side from Madras Street to the Gas Works' Road.

East Town Belt—West side from the Ferry Road to Armagh Street.

Antigua Street—East side from Kilmore Street to Salisbury Street.

Salisbury Street—North side from Durham Street to Colombo Street.

Salisbury Street—South side from Durham Street to Colombo Street.
