PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Protection of Animals Act Amendment Act, 1868," it is among other things enacted that no Native Game shall be hunted, shot, taken, or killed in any part of the Colony except during such months as the Governor shall from time to time by Proclamation appoint in reference to the respective descriptions of Native Game within the districts mentioned in such Proclamation.

And whereas his Excellency the Governor hath with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony delegated to me, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, so long as I shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, all the powers vested by "The Protection of Animals Act, 1867," and by "The Protection of Animals Act Amendment Act, 1868," in the Governor or the Governor in Council to be exercised only in respect to the said Province.

Now therefore I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent as aforesaid, in virtue of all powers in me vested in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and appoint the months of

April, May, June, and July as the months during which all the Native Game mentioned in the fifth schedule to "The Protection of Animals Act, 1867," as amended by "The Protection of Animals Act Amendment Act, 1868," may be hunted, shot, taken or killed within the following district, that is to say—

All that portion of the Province of Canterbury not included in the Timaru and Gladstone Electoral Districts..

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Esq.,  
Superintendent of the Province of  
Canterbury.

**W**HEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, entitled "The Education Ordinance, 1864," it is, among other things, enacted that whenever the Board of Education shall call by advertisement a public meeting of owners and occupiers of land and householders in any district, and such meeting shall declare by the votes of the majority of the persons present, (being such owners and occupiers of land and householders as aforesaid), that they are willing that the said district be formed into an Educational District under the provisions of the said Ordinance, and shall declare their willingness to provide the proportion of the annual expenses of an Educational District: the Superintendent shall, as soon as conveniently may be, by Proclamation in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, declare such district to be an Educational District under the said Ordinance; and such district shall thereupon become an Educational District accordingly:

And whereas at a meeting duly called as aforesaid, and held at Watson's Half-way House Hotel, West Coast road, on Saturday, the Sixth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, the owners and occupiers of land and householders in the district specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, did by the votes of the majority there present declare that they were willing that the said district should be formed into an Educational District, and did further declare their willingness to

provide the proportion of the annual expenses of an Educational District as provided in the said Ordinance:

Now therefore, I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the power in me vested by the said in part recited Ordinance, do hereby proclaim that the district specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, shall be an Educational District within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### HALKETT EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point on the southern bank of the River Waimakariri, in a line with the north-western corner of section 3802; thence continuing the said line southerly along the western boundary of the said section; thence crossing the road at the south of this section, and continuing the line along the western boundary of section 3801; thence in a straight line to the north-western corner of section 8751; thence southerly along the western boundaries of this latter section and of sections 9204, 9170, and 9089, to the south-western corner of the latter section; thence easterly along its southern boundary to the road lying to the west of section 8954; thence southerly along such road to the junction with the road lying to the south-west of section 8788; thence south-easterly along this latter road to its junction with the road lying to the south of sections 8899 and 7958, (Bealey's Track); thence easterly along this latter road to the south-east corner of section 6469; thence in a straight line to the easternmost corner of section 7995; thence continuing the same straight line to the south bank of the River Waimakariri; and thence westerly along such bank to the starting point.
