HIS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that he has made the following Reserves, temporarily, under the 19th clause of the Waste Lands Regulations, viz. :—

No. 1080, in red.—Three hundred and ten acres, more or less, situate in the Oxford District, commencing at a point on the Forest road, the same being sixty-nine chains fifty links distant from and north-east of Trig. station O'36; thence westerly at an angle of 41 deg. with the said road, a distance of one hundred and two chains to the northern bank of the Waimakariri; thence southerly and easterly following the said bank to the road before-mentioned; and from thence returning along the road to the commencing point: subject nevertheless to sections 7735, 6766, and 3599.

LANE v. FRANKS.

WRIT OF *Fieri Facias*.
