**PROCLAMATION**

By his Honor **WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Esq.**,  
Superintendent of the Province of  
Canterbury.

**W**HEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, entitled "The Canterbury Police Ordinance, 1 58, Session X., No. 1," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent by Proclamation, to declare the said Ordinance to be in operation within any town, upon the requisition to that effect from a majority of the Justices of the Peace of the district in which such town is situated.

Now therefore, I, **WILLIAM ROLLESTON**, Superintendent as aforesaid, do hereby, upon the requisition of a majority of the Justices of the Peace of the Geraldine District, proclaim and declare that the Canterbury Police Ordinance shall be and is hereby brought into operation within the townships of Wallingford and Arowhenua in the said district.
