PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, Session VII., No. 7, intituled "An Ordinance for the Regulation of Prisons," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for his Excellency the Governor, from time to time, as to him shall seem meet, by Proclamation, to declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a public gaol; and after the publication of any

such Proclamation, such house, building, enclosure, or place shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Gaol.

And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, intituled "The Empowering Ordinance, Session II., No. 2," it is enacted that the powers conferred on the Governors of New Zealand by the above recited Ordinance are within the limits of the Province of Canterbury conferred on the Superintendent thereof. And whereas it is desirable that the building recently erected on Section No. 72, at Addington, near Christchurch, in the said Province, should be proclaimed a Public Gaol.

Now therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province, by virtue of the powers vested in me, do hereby proclaim and declare that the building aforesaid shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Gaol.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand passed in the twenty-second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "The Provincial Reserved Bills Act, 1858," it was enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been passed by the Provincial Council of any Province, and shall have been reserved by the Superintendent for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon, such Bill shall not have any force or authority within the said Province until the Superintendent shall signify either by speech or message to the Provincial Council, or by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, that such Bill has been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor has assented to the same.

And whereas certain Bills intituled—

- "Reserve No. 461 Ordinance,"
- "Reserve No. 738 Ordinance,"
- "Canal Reserve Ordinance,"
- "The Educational Reserves Leasing Ordinance, 1871,"
- "Reserve No. 168 Ordinance,"
- "Reserve No. 262 Ordinance,"

were passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, and the same were reserved by the Superintendent of the said Province for the assent of his Excellency the Governor.

Now therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that the aforesaid Bills have been laid before his Excellency the Governor, and that his Excellency has assented to the same.

HIS Honor the Deputy-Superintendent directs the publication of the following Regulations adopted by the Board of Education for the conduct of its business, under the provisions of "The Education Ordinance, 1871."

1. At every meeting of the Board the chair shall be taken within fifteen minutes after the hour appointed for such meeting. If after the expiration of such fifteen minutes there be not present the quorum of members provided by the Education Ordinance the Chairman of the Board or in his absence the Secretary shall declare the Meeting adjourned to the next day for the Ordinary Meeting of the Board.

2. The Ordinary Meetings of the Board shall be held on the first and third Monday in every month at the hour of three o'clock and notice of each meeting shall be given by circular addressed and posted to each member of the Board not less than seven days before such meeting.

3. The Chairman may at his own instance or upon a requisition in writing addressed to him by any three members of the Board call a Special Meeting of the Board and due and convenient notice of such meeting shall be addressed and posted to each member and such notice shall specify the business to be brought before such meeting.

4. Minutes of all proceedings of the Board shall be kept by the Secretary and at every meeting of the Board the minutes of the previous meeting shall be read and submitted for confirmation before any other business be transacted.

5. After the minutes have been submitted for confirmation the Chairman or Secretary shall lay before the Board all correspondence statements and all other general information that may have been received since the previous meeting of the Board.

6. Except as herein otherwise provided no member shall initiate any subject for discussion unless in pursuance of notice in writing openly given at a previous meeting of the Board.

7. All business of which such notice has been given shall be taken into consideration before the ordinary business of the Board.

8. The ordinary business of the Board as laid before it by the Chairman and Secretary shall then be proceeded with.

9. All business of the Board shall be decided by resolution to be submitted by the member moving the same who shall if required thereto by the Chairman hand in such resolution in writing to the chair.

10. Every resolution or amendment not seconded shall drop without discussion.

11. After a resolution or amendment has been put by the Chairman it shall not be withdrawn without leave of the Board.

12. Amendments to any resolution may be moved without notice.

13. In putting the original resolution as well as amendments if any the Chairman shall conform to the mode prescribed by the standing orders of the Provincial Council.

14. Every member when speaking shall address the chair and shall not speak twice on the same subject (except the Board resolve otherwise previous to the discussion) unless in explanation of some material point on which he has been misunderstood and without introducing any new matter. Provided also that the mover of any resolution not being an amendment shall be allowed the liberty of reply.

15. When any question of order shall arise it shall be immediately taken into consideration and decided by the Chairman and the matter in debate shall be suspended until the decision of the Chairman has been given.

16. Any meeting shall be adjourned only on motion to that effect duly carried.

17. At all Special Meetings of the Board no other business shall be transacted except that for which the meeting has been called.

18. Any one of these regulations may be suspended at any meeting of the Board without notice if agreed to by all the members present not being less than six in number.

19. Until otherwise ordered the meetings of the Board shall be private but reporters for the public press may be admitted and may be allowed to take copies of the recorded proceedings of the Board. Strangers if admitted and reporters may however at any time be ordered to withdraw by the Chairman or by resolution of the Board.
