Order in Council at the Provincial Government Buildings, Christchurch, the 12th day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," it is among other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, as may become necessary, to make such regulations as to the Governor seems expedient, for prohibiting or restricting from time to time for any period which the Governor thinks necessary, fishing in any river or stream in which young salmon, salmon fry, or spawn, or young trout, trout fry, or spawn is placed or deposited, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream:

And whereas by Section 12 of the said Act, the Governor may, by Order in Council, under his hand, and the public seal of the Colony, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent or the Provincial Executive of any Province, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council by the said Act:

And whereas the said Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Canterbury, all the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said Act exercisable within the said Province:

And whereas for the protection of the trout placed in the River Avon, the Provincial Executive hath by Regulations made in that behalf, dated respectively the 24th day of March, 1869, and the 22nd day of November, 1870, prohibited fishing in the said river, from its source to the east boundary of the City of Christchurch:

And whereas it is expedient to make further provision for the protection of the said trout:

Now, therefore, the Provincial Executive of the said Province, in pursuance and exercise of the powers delegated to it, doth hereby make the following Regulation.

No person shall fish in the River Avon, between the East Boundary of the City of Christchurch and New Brighton, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty Pounds, or to such portion only of such penalty as the Justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered shall think fit.

~~This Regulation shall not apply to the catching of Whitebait with nets.~~

IN exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, do hereby assent to the regulations and prohibitory declarations contained in a Proclamation issued by William Rolleston, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, dated the twenty-fifth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

Given under the hand of his Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House, Wellington, this twenty-second day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Weights and Measures Act, 1868, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to appoint one Inspector of Weights and Measures for any Province, County, Borough, or District, or for each of two or more divisions of any Province, County, Borough, or District, the boundaries of which divisions shall be proclaimed from time to time in the *New Zealand Gazette* by the Governor: And whereas it is expedient that Inspectors should be appointed for the

divisions of the Province of Canterbury, the boundaries whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereto, and that the boundaries of such divisions should be proclaimed :

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, G.C.M.G., Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that for the purposes of the said Act there shall be within the said Province of Canterbury divisions or districts, the boundaries whereof shall be the boundaries set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

CHRISTCHURCH DISTRICT.

Bounded on the northward by the south bank of the Hurunui River ; on the westward by the County of Westland ; on the southward by the north bank of the Rangitata River from the sea to the source of its tributary the Clyde River ; and on the eastward by the sea, save and except the District of Akaroa, hereinafter defined.

AKAROA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Northward by the summit of the range running by Mount Herbert and Mount Herbert Peak, and also by the sea ; on the eastward and southward by the sea ; on the westward by Lake Ellesmere from its outlet to the sea to the mouth of the River Halswell, by that river to the western boundary of Section 1879, thence by that boundary and the Ahuriri Bush Road south to the southern boundary of Section 1901, by that boundary and also by the ridge of hills by Cooper's Knobs.

TIMARU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the northward by the north bank of the Rangitata River from the sea to the source of its tributary the Clyde River ; on the west by the County of Westland ; on the southward by the Province of Otago ; and on the eastward by the sea.

Given under the hand of his Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same ; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House at Wellington, this eleventh day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.
