**H**IS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that he has made the following Reserves, temporarily, under the 19th clause of the Waste Lands Regulations, for Gravel Pits, viz. :—

No. 1345, in red.—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Malvern District, having frontage of five chains to the road forming the north-eastern boundary of section 8193, and extending south-westerly a distance of ten chains in a rectangular block, the easternmost corner of this reserve is situate about ten and a-half chains north-west of the northernmost corner of section 8193.

No. 1346, in red.—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Malvern District, bounded on the north-eastward by the Little Racecourse Hill and Kowai Road; on the north-westward

by the Dalethorpe and Kowai Road; and on the south-westward by a line at right angles to the latter road, so as to contain the above quantity.

No. 1347, in red.—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Malvern District, bounded on the northward by the Dalethorpe Road; on the north-eastward by the Coal Tramway Reserve; on the south-eastward by the road forming the north-western boundary of Reserve No. 424 (in red); and on the south-westward by a line at right angles to the last mentioned road, so as to include the above quantity.

No. 1348, in red.—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Malvern District, bounded on the north-eastward by the Kowai Road; on the south-westward by the Coal Tramway Reserve; and on the north-westward by a line at right angles to the said Reserve, so as to contain the above quantity.

- No. 1349, in red.—Ten acres, more or less, situate in the Malvern District, having frontage of eight chains to the road forming the north-west boundary of section 9144, and extending south-easterly a distance of twelve chains fifty links in a rectangular block south-west of and adjoining the section above-mentioned.
