PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the eighth section of "The Canterbury Public Domains Act, 1872," it is enacted that the Superintendent of Canterbury, with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, may, by Proclamation under his hand from time to time, delegate all or any of the powers thereby conferred upon him acting as aforesaid to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations, conditions, and limitations as may be specified in such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of my Executive Council, do hereby delegate in respect of the lands contained in the Schedule hereto annexed, all the powers conferred by the said Act to the undermentioned persons,

who shall be known as "The Kowai Pass Racecourse Trustees":—

subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained.

1. The Trustees shall meet at such times and places as shall be from time to time appointed by the Chairman, or when it shall be convened by him and the business shall be conducted under such regulations as shall be determined on by the Trustees.
2. The Trustees shall keep proper minutes and records of their proceedings, and full accounts of their receipts and

expenditure, and a yearly statement of the same, together with a general report of their proceedings, shall be forwarded to the Superintendent once in every year.

3. This delegation of powers to the Trustees shall not in any way affect any lease or contract now in force between the Superintendent and any person or persons in respect of any portion of the Reserve No. 1252 (in red) in the Schedule to "The Public Domains Ordinance, 1873," nor any agreement between the Superintendent and any person or persons in respect of the dedication of any portion of the said lands to any purpose of public recreation or amusement.

#### SCHEDULE.

Description of reserve No. 1252 (in red), being a site for a Public Recreation Ground and Racecourse:—

All that parcel of land in the Province of Canterbury, in the Colony of New Zealand, situate in the Malvern district, containing by admeasurement one hundred acres, more or less, commencing at a point on the north-eastern side of the Coal Tramway Reserve, the said point being the westernmost corner of section 14381; thence north-westerly following the said reserve a distance of eleven chains sixty links; thence northerly following the road forming the eastern boundary of reserve No. 1248 (in red) thirty-four chains eleven links; thence easterly along the southern boundary of section No. 9256, a distance of twenty-seven chains seventy-five links to the high bank of an old river bed; thence south-easterly following the said high bank to a point in line with the north-western boundary of the said section No. 14381, and from thence returning south-westerly along the said line and boundary forty-two chains ten links to the commencing point, and numbered 1252 (in red) on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Canterbury, setting out and describing the rural land in the Malvern district aforesaid.

2. The Board shall keep proper minutes and records of its proceedings, and full accounts of its receipts and expenditure, and a yearly statement of the same, together with a general report of its proceedings, shall be forwarded to the Superintendent once in every year.
3. This delegation of powers to the Board shall not in any way affect any lease or contract now in force between the Superintendent and any person or persons in respect of any portion of the Reserve numbered 74 (in red) in the Schedule to "The Public Domains Ordinance, 1873," nor any agreement between the Superintendent and any person or persons in respect of the dedication of any portion of the said lands to any purpose of public recreation or amusement.

## SCHEDULE.

Description of reserve No. 74 (in red), being a site for a Public Recreation Ground :—

All that parcel of land situate in the Mandeville district, in the Province of Canterbury, containing fifteen acres thirty-two perches, more or less, commencing at a point on the North Road, the same being the north-west corner of section No. 338 E., following along the said road in a northerly direction a distance of nineteen chains, and running back easterly a distance of eight chains in a rectangular block, and numbered 74 in red on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Canterbury, setting out and describing the rural land in the Mandeville district aforesaid.

## PUBLIC NOTICE.

**T**he following Public House Licenses were granted at the Adjourned Licensing Meeting of the Kaiapoi Bench of Magis-

trates held on Tuesday, the 24th day of June, 1873 :—

JAMES BASSINGTHWAITE, Rangiora, Hotel.  
SAMUEL GREEN, Rangiora, Country Hotel.  
GEORGE CLARK, Kaiapoi, Country Hotel.  
DAVID ROBERTSON, Waikari, Country Hotel.  
JOHN CLIST, Flaxton, Country Hotel.

TYSON HODGSON, Conditional License, Ashley Bank.

1. All the premises to be kept in good repair. To provide in his house, besides the taproom, or room answering as such, one public and one private sitting-room.

2. To provide not less than eight beds for travellers, in not less than seven separate bedrooms.

3. To provide a shed sufficiently weather-tight and fit for the accommodation of at least four horses.

4. At all times to keep a proper supply of water for the house, and for horses and cattle, and to provide, in a convenient position, a proper trough for watering cattle.

5. To keep at all times a proper supply of oats and oaten or grass hay. Oats to be charged for to travellers at not more than 6d. per quart, and to be always served out with the authorised quart measure.

6. To provide and keep in repair a good and sufficient stockyard for cattle, containing a superficial area of not less than ten square yards. For the occupation of this yard during the night, the licensee may make a charge at rates not exceeding the following, viz. :—Twopence per head for all cattle under 50 in number, and one penny per head for all over that number.

7. To keep a lamp burning with two burners, from sunset to sunrise, giving a sufficiently bright light, and being so lighted as to be conspicuous from a distance all round the house.

8. To be sworn in and to act as a constable, especially when required by the Magistrates or the Police.

9. On all occasions to render every assistance, and to supply information to Magistrates and to the Police in the execution of their duty.

10. To keep a clean and orderly house, and to render it as comfortable for the accommodation of travellers as the circumstances of position and distance from towns will fairly allow.

11. To keep at all times a safe horse in good working order, and ready for conveyance of passengers across the Ashley, between the hours of sunrise and sunset. The

fare to be as follows:—For foot passengers, one shilling each between the hours above named; the fares to be doubled at all other times. Officers of the Supreme Court, Magistrates, and Police Constables on duty, and prisoners, to be ferried free of charge. To afford every assistance in his power in directing strangers to a safe fording across the river.

12. The license to be cancelled by order of any three Justices of the Peace, if it be proved to their satisfaction that any of the conditions of the license are not regularly fulfilled, or if any drunkenness be proved to have been allowed on the premises, or if any spirits shall be supplied from the house or premises to any Aboriginal Native of New Zealand.

13. A printed or fairly written copy of these conditions, and a tariff of all charges to be kept at all times posted up in some conspicuous place in the taproom and in all the sitting-rooms, for the information of travellers.

14. To provide a visitors' book, which shall be kept in the custody of the licensee, but whenever asked for shall be produced to visitors and lodgers for the insertion of any remark on the accommodation or attendance; a notice to this effect to be kept posted in the same manner as the tariff of charges. The book to be open at all times to inspection by Magistrates or the Police, and to be sent to the Clerk of the Bench at Kaiapoi a week before the Annual Licensing Meeting, for the purpose of being produced at that meeting.
