BONUS OF £2000.

CONDITIONS.

1. The woollen fabrics on account of which the bonus is claimed must be produced from a manufactory permanently established and working in the Province of Canterbury, and not transferred from any other Province.
2. The bonus will not be paid unless satisfactory proof is given of the production within a period of two years of marketable woollen fabrics to the value of not less than five thousand pounds.
3. Notice of the intention to claim the bonus must be given to the Provincial Secretary not later than December 31, 1873.
4. The bonus will be paid on the certificate of an officer appointed by the Provincial Government that the above conditions have been complied with.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1873," it is among other things provided that the Superintendent may, under the provisions of Section 26 of the said Ordinance, declare any Portion of the Province not comprised within the limits of any Educational District, to be an Educational District :

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare the portions of the Province hereinafter described to be Educational Districts, with such names and with such boundaries as are hereinafter set forth :—

NAME OF DISTRICT.	BOUNDARIES.
East Christchurch Educational District ...	Commencing at the junction of Colombo Street with the North Town Belt ; thence easterly by the Town Belt to the south-east corner of section 287 ; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of said section to its north-east corner ; thence easterly by a line at right angles to last-mentioned boundary to Dudley's Creek ; thence by Dudley's Creek to western boundary of section 182 ; thence southerly to south-west corner of said section ; thence easterly by the southern boundary of said section and by a line in continuation thereof to its junction with section 87 ; thence by the road on south bank of the River Avon along northern and eastern boundaries of said section, eastern boundary of section 90, part of northern boundary of section 125, and north-west and northern boundaries of section 161 to the north-east corner of the latter section ; thence southerly by the road forming eastern boundary of section 161 and eastern and south-eastern boundaries of section 326 to south-east corner of said section ; thence to the north-east corner of section 301 ; thence southerly and westerly by eastern boundaries of said section and section 69 to the Ferry Road ; thence to the north-east corner of section 62 ; thence southerly along eastern boundary of said section to the Railway ; thence by the Railway to Colombo Street ; thence along Colombo Street to the starting point.
West Christchurch Educational District ...	Commencing at the junction of Colombo Street with Railway ; thence west by the Railway to the eastern boundary of section 17 ; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the said section, and westerly by the southern boundary of said section and section 66, to the south-west corner of the latter section ; thence south-westerly by a straight line at right angles to Mein's Road, forming the south-western boundary of section 154 ; thence north-westerly along the said road to Lincoln Road ; thence along that road to the south-west corner of section 113 ; thence north-westerly

	<p>to the north-western boundary of said section; thence by the northern boundary of section 113 and section 9 to the Town Belt; thence by the Town Belt to the River Avon; thence by the River Avon to the North Town Belt; thence by the North Town Belt to Colombo Street; thence southerly by Colombo Street to the starting point.</p>
Rangiora Educational District ...	<p>Bounded on the north by the River Ashley; on the west by the Fernside Education District; on the south by the Southbrook Education District; on the east by the Native Reserve and Woodend and Waikuku Education Districts.</p>
Lower Heathcote Educational District ...	<p>Commencing at the south-west corner of section 48; thence south-easterly along the line of Railway to the River Heathcote; thence following down the said River Heathcote to the Swing Bridge; thence in a northerly direction by the estuary to the north-west corner of section 574; thence westerly in a straight line until it meets the south-east corner of section 7506; thence westerly following along the road forming the southern boundaries of the said section and sections 6356, 5839, 5854, and 7198, to the south-west corner of section 7819; thence south-westerly along the road forming the eastern boundaries of sections 7939 and 8980 to the southernmost corner of the latter section; thence westerly in a straight line to the north-east corner of Reserve 212; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that reserve until it meets the eastern boundary of section 4533; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of said section and section 901 to the south-east corner of the latter section; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the said section to the road forming the western boundaries of sections 107 and 1144; thence along that road to the south-west corner of the said section; thence northerly along the southern boundary of section 326 to the northernmost corner of section 347; thence by the western boundaries of the said section and section 84 to the south-west corner of the latter section; thence westerly along the Ferry Road to the north-western corner of section 48; thence southerly by the western boundary of the said section to the starting point.</p>
