PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1873," it is among other things provided that the Superintendent may, under the provisions of Section 26 of the said Ordinance, declare any portion of the Province not comprised within the limits of any Educational District, to be an Educational District:

Now, therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare the portion of the Province hereinafter described, to be an Educational District, with the name and boundaries as hereinafter set forth:—

NAME OF DISTRICT.	BOUNDARIES.
Kaiapoi Island, North	Bounded on the north by the north branch of the Waimakariri; on the west and south by the Waimakariri and the Kaiapoi Island Educational District; on the east by the Kaiapoi Borough Educational District.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, passed in the twenty-second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "The Provincial Reserved Bills Act, 1858," it is enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been passed by the Provincial Council of any Province, and shall have been reserved by the Superintendent for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon, such Bill shall not have any force or authority within the said Province until the Superintendent shall signify, either by speech or message, to the Provincial Council, or by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, that such Bill has been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor has assented to the same.

"The Reserve No. 424 Ordinance, 1873."

were passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, and the same were reserved by the Superintendent of the said Province for the assent of his Excellency the Governor:
