PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the owners and occupiers of land and householders in the Educational District of Southbrook have failed within the time limited for that purpose by the Board of Education to contribute and pay to the Provincial Treasurer the amount fixed by the Board as the contributions of the said district for the purchase of a school site and cost of erecting school buildings, &c.:

Now, therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a uniform rate of elevenpence in the pound to be leviable within the said district, under the provisions of section 42 of "The Education Ordinance, 1873," and I do hereby appoint

as the person to whom the said rate shall be paid.

PROCLAMATION.

I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of the powers vested in me under the provisions of "The Canterbury Sheep Ordinance, 1872," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby order that all sheep introduced by land from the Province of Otago shall be dressed, to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Sheep for the Province of Canterbury, with a preparation of tobacco of a strength to be

determined by the Inspector of Sheep aforesaid, before such sheep shall be driven or depastured at a greater distance within the Province of Canterbury than three miles from that part of the boundary at which such sheep shall have been introduced.

#### PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1873," it is among other things provided that the Superintendent may, under the provisions of Section 26 of the said Ordinance, declare any portion of the Province not comprised within the limits of any Educational District, to be an Educational District:

Now, therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare the portion of the Province hereinafter described, to be an Educational District, with the name and boundaries as hereinafter set forth:—

Malvern            ...            ...            ...	Bounded on the east by the Upper Courtenay Education District; thence westerly in a straight line from the south-west corner of Section 4027 to the south-east corner of Section 4119; thence westerly along the southern boundary of said section, and in a straight line to the south-east corner of Reserve 986; thence westerly along the southern boundary of said reserve to its south-west corner; thence westerly in a straight line to the south-east corner of Section 8982; thence south-westerly along the southern boundary of said section to its south-west corner; thence westerly in a straight line to the south-east corner of Section 11363; thence westerly along the southern boundary of said section to its south-west corner; thence north-westerly in a straight line to the south-west corner of Section 11385; thence northerly along the western boundary of said section to its north-west corner; thence northerly in a straight line to the south-west corner of Section 15714; thence north-easterly along the road forming the southern boundary of said section, and the western boundary of Section 12700 to the Waimakariri; thence along the Waimakariri to the starting point.
