PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the owners and occupiers of land and householders in the Educational District of Lincoln have failed within the time limited for that purpose by the Board of Education to contribute and pay to the Provincial Treasurer the amount fixed by the Board as the contribution of the said district for school purposes :

19th clause of the Waste Lands Regulations, viz. :—

- No. 1264A, (in red)—Nineteen acres, more or less, situate in the Timaru District, bounded on the eastward by Burke's Pass Road, on the southward by a line in continuation of the northern side of the road forming the northern boundary of section 6285, on the westward by section 13695, on the northward by a line at right angles to the aforesaid road, so as to contain the above quantity. For Police Purposes.
- No. 1852, (in red). One rood and sixteen perches, more or less, being section No. 1 in the Town of Bealey, bounded on the northward by the northern boundary of the said Township; on the southward by Albion Street, on the westward by the West Coast Road, and on the eastward by St. George's Terrace.—For Police Purposes.
- No. 1860 (in red)—Nine acres, more or less, situate in the Oxford District, bounded on the south-westward by the Oxford and Ohoka road; on the north-eastward by section No. 8816; and on the south-eastward by the road forming the south-eastern boundary thereof.—For Gravel Pit.
