PROCLAMATION,

Revoking Proclamation of 3rd August, 1874, requiring sheep introduced by land from Nelson to be dressed.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the 3rd day of August, 1874, and published in the Provincial *Government Gazette*, No. 37 of the 4th August, 1874, it was ordered that all sheep introduced by land from the Province of Nelson should be dressed to the satisfaction of the Inspector of sheep for the Province of Canterbury:

Now therefore I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury in pursuance of the powers vested in the Superintendent by "The Canterbury Sheep Ordinance, 1872," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1873," it is among other things provided that the Superintendent may, under the provisions of Section 26 of the said Ordinance, declare any portion of the Province not comprised

within the limits of any Educational District to be an Educational District.

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare the portion of the Province hereinafter described to be an Educational District, with the name and with the boundaries as are hereinafter set forth:—

SOUTH ASHBURTON EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Commencing where the Great South Road and Ashburton Road South, running through Section 4354 and Section No. 7822, &c., join; thence along the Great South Road to the Road running on the south side of Section 20348; thence along this Road easterly to the south-east corner of Section 16744; thence easterly and northerly along the Road forming the eastern boundary of Section 16744 and the southern boundaries of Sections 16691, 16688, 16461, 7240, and running through Section 7261 to the Road forming southern boundary of Reserve 758; thence south-easterly along this Road to the Road to the western boundary of Section 6803; thence northerly along the latter Road and the Road forming eastern boundaries of Reserve 737, Sections 18078, 18077, 2145, and 18003 to the Ashburton Road South, running through Sections 7822, &c., and Section 4354;

thence along the last mentioned road to the starting point.

KNOW ALL MEN by these presents that I Kenneth McIntosh of Kaiapoi in the Province of Canterbury in New Zealand farmer being seized in fee simple of that part of Rural Section numbered 360 on the map of the Chief Surveyor of the said Province of Canterbury setting out the Rural Lands in the Mandeville District commencing at the south-western corner of the said Section running thence northerly along the western boundary of the said Section a distance of fifty links and thence easterly in a rectangular block a distance of thirty chains to the eastern boundary of the said Section being bounded on the south by the southern boundary of the said Section and delineated and coloured pink in the

HIS Honor the Superintendent, in pursuance of certain powers vested in him by "The Empowering Ordinance, Session II, No. 2," directs it to be notified that the Footpaths hereinafter described having been well and sufficiently made and completed for the use and accommodation of foot passengers, according to the provisions of "The Footpaths' Ordinance, Session VIII, No. 12," are hereby declared to be public footpaths, and from and after the date hereof shall be deemed and taken accordingly to be public footpaths within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

The said footpaths are as follows:—

SPREYDON DISTRICT.

- On both sides of Harper Street, from the South Town Belt to the Pound Road.
- On both sides of Durham Street South, from South Town Belt to the Pound Road.
- On both sides of First Street, from Harper Street to Colombo Street South.
- On both sides of Second Street, from Harper Street to Colombo Street South.
- On both sides of Third Street, from Harper Street to Colombo Street South.
- On both sides of Fourth Street, from Durham Street to Colombo Street South.
- On both sides of Fifth Street, from Durham Street to Colombo Street South.
- On both sides of Sixth Street, from Durham Street to Colombo Street South.
- On the West side of Selwyn Street, from the South Town Belt to Hamilton Street.
- On both sides of Park Road, from the South Town Belt round the Church Reserve to the Creek, thence along both sides of Ward Street into Selwyn Street.
- On both sides of Harman Street, from Selwyn Street to the Lower Lincoln Road.
- On both sides of Poulson Street, from

Selwyn Street to the Church Reserve, and thence to the Lower Lincoln Road.
 On the East side of half-chain Road, running from Harman Street to Poulson Street, next Road west of Selwyn Street.

HEATHCOTE DISTRICT.

On the South side of Old Stanmore Road, from the East Town Belt a distance of about 12 chains in an easterly direction.
 On both sides of the continuation of Cashel Street, from the East Town Belt to the junction of Cashel Street and Old Stanmore Road.
 On both sides of the continuation of Hereford Street, from the East Town Belt to Stanmore Road.
 On both sides of the continuation of Worcester Street, from the East Town Belt a distance of about 13 chains in an easterly direction.
 On both sides of the continuation of Gloucester Street, from the East Town Belt to Stanmore Road.
 On both sides of the continuation of Armagh Street, from the East Town Belt a distance of about 13 chains in an easterly direction, and about 4 chains in a northerly direction, to its junction with a road leading from Hanmer Street to Haast Street at the eastern end of Haast Street.
 On both sides of Haast Street, from Armagh Street to Stanmore Road.
 On both sides of Hanmer Street, from Armagh Street to Avon River Road.
 On the South side of Road leading from Hanmer Street to Haast Street, so far as the Road runs in an easterly direction about five chains, and on the West side of the remainder running in a southerly direction to Armagh Street as far as the eastern end of Haast Street.
 On both sides of a Road leading from Hanmer Street westerly, in the direction of Chester Street a distance of about four chains.
 On South side of the Drain Road, from the East Town Belt to Duncan's Nursery Road.
 On both sides of the continuation of St. Asaph Street, from the East Town Belt to Duncan's Nursery Road.
 On both sides of the Creek Road, from the East Town Belt, to Phillips Street, and thence continued on both sides to Duncan's Nursery Road.
 On both sides of Phillips Street, from Ferry Road to the Drain Road.
 On the west side of Duncan's Nursery Road, from the Ferry Road to the Drain Road, and on the East side for about 13 chains to the Cross Road leading into Matheson's Road, and on the East side of the continuation of Duncan's Nursery Road to Stanmore Road.
 On both sides of Road, leading from Dun-

can's Nursery Road into Matheson's Road.
 On both sides of Matheson's Road, from Ferry Road to Drain Road.
 On the North side of the Ferry Road, from Duncan's Nursery Road to Ollivier's Road, and on the South side from the Christchurch Quay to the Steam Wharf.
 On the West side of the Gas Works Road, from the Gas Works to Innes' Brewery.
 On the North side of Goring's Road, from the Gas Works Road towards Colombo Road, a distance of about 10 chains.
 On the South side of St. Andrew's or Scott Street, from the Gas Works Road in a westerly direction about 25 chains.
 On the South side of Salisbury Street, in a westerly direction about 25 chains.
 On both sides of Colombo Road, from the South Town Belt as far as Piper's Road, and from Dyer's Pass Road about 14 chains in a northerly direction on both sides, the East side being in the Heathcote District, and the West side in the Spreydon District.
 On the North-west side of a Road, from the Foot Bridge over River Heathcote at St. Martin's crossing Wilson's Road about five chains below Wilson's Bridge, to within about four chains of the river again near the residence of Mr. Charles Jones.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE PIGEON BAY CEMETERY :—

1. The Managers appointed by the Superintendent under "The Cemetery Reserves Management Ordinance, 1870," shall have the entire control and management of the Pigeon Bay Cemetery.
2. The Managers having power by the 9th Section of the said Ordinance to allocate portions of the Cemetery to the various religious denominations requiring the same, no interference will be permitted with such allocations. A portion of the Cemetery will be set apart as open ground for purposes of general interment.
3. Persons desirous of obtaining an exclusive right in any plot of ground in the Cemetery for the purpose of making graves or family vaults, or erecting monuments, may do so at a rate not exceeding 5s. per square yard, such persons shall receive the following document signed by one of the Managers and the Secretary.

 Received from A.B. of....., the sum of.....for that piece of ground part of the.....Cemetery, at.....numbered.....on the plan of the cemetery in the custody of the Managers; the said piece of ground to be

held by the said A.B. subject to the rules for the time being in force for the management of the said Cemetery.

4. Applications for this purpose may be made to the Managers or to the Secretary, or other person authorised by them to receive the same.
5. Every burial plot shall be not more than 16 feet by 9 feet 6 inches, and every grave shall be 5 feet in depth at the least. In the event of the purchaser of private ground desiring a greater depth, an extra charge of 2s. 6d. shall be made for every foot more than 5 feet.
6. All railings or erections of any kind shall be subject to the approval of the Managers.
7. Any purchaser of private ground may transfer his or her interest therein to any other person, upon payment of a fee of 5s. for such transfer.
8. A plan of the Cemetery shall be kept, showing the plots as laid off in the several divisions; and each plot shall have a separate number on the plan.
9. A book shall be kept in which shall be entered the number of every plot sold; the name of the purchaser thereof, together with the date of the sale or transfer of the same. A register shall also be kept of all burials in the Cemetery, which register shall be open for the inspection of the public, on payment of a fee of 1s. for each inspection.
10. In all cases of intended interment, the person having the management or control of the same, shall apply to the Sexton, or other duly authorised person, for a warrant for such interment, which warrant shall be granted upon payment of the following fees, viz. :—

11. The whole or a part of the foregoing costs and charges will be remitted on proof being given to the satisfaction of the Managers that the person for whom application for interment is made was a pauper, or in poor circumstances at the time of his or her death, and that there are not sufficient funds applicable for the purpose, and that no person is liable for the payment of such costs and charges.
12. Orders for interment must be given at least ten hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral.

The following particulars must accompany the order :—

- Name of deceased.
- Age.
- Denomination.
- Officiating Minister.
- Day and hour of funeral.
- If unpurchased ground.
- No. of plot (if private ground).
- Required depth (if more than 5 feet).
