On the north side of the Riccarton Road, from the Hospital to the south-west corner of the park opposite the Plough Inn, and from thence on the east side of the road to the south-east corner of the park opposite the Fendalton bridge.

A five-foot-wide footpath on the north side of the road from the Carlton bridge to the Fendalton bridge.
