PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the owners and occupiers of land and householders in the Educational District of Irwell have failed, within the time limited for that purpose by the Board of Education, to contribute and pay to the Provincial Treasurer the amount fixed by the Board as the contribution of the said district for school purposes:

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM ROLLESTON, Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an uniform rate of eightpence half-penny in the £, to be leviable within the said district, under the provisions of the 42nd section of "The Education Ordinance, 1873," and I do hereby appoint

JAMES CARSTON

as the person to whom the said rate shall be paid.

HIS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified that he has made the following Reserves, upon the recommendation of the Provincial Council, viz:—

No. 1846 (in red).—Two acres one rood and thirty-six perches, more or less, being Sections Nos. 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, and 43, situate in the township of Arowhenua. For General Government purposes.

No. 1847 (in red).—Two acres three roods and twenty-one perches, more or less, situate in the township of Geraldine; bounded on the southward by the southern boundary of the said town; on the westward by Talbot Street; on the northward by Reserve No. 1373 (in red); and on the eastward by the River Waihi, and also by the terrace crossing the southern boundary of the town, at a point about 1 chain 30 links east of Talbot Street aforesaid. For General Government purposes.

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- No. 1852 (in red).—One rood and sixteen perches, more or less, being Section No. 1 in the town of Bealey; bounded on the northward by the northern boundary of the said township; on the southward by Albion Street; on the westward by the West Coast Road; and on the eastward by St. George's Terrace. For police purposes.
- No. 1868 (in red).—Ten acres, more or less, situate in the Oxford District; bounded on the northward by the road along the southern boundary of Sections 10035 and 10040; on the westward by a road 2 chains wide; on the southward and south-eastward by the River Eyre. For gravel pit.
- No. 1874 (in red).—Five acres, situate in the Malvern District; bounded on the north-eastward by the road forming the south-western boundary of Section 13530; on the south-eastward by the road forming the north-western boundary of Section 12862; on the south-west by a line parallel to the north-eastern boundary and 10 chains distant therefrom; and on the north-westward by a line at right angles to the north-eastern boundary, so as to include the above quantity. For gravel pit.
- No. 1875 (in red).—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Oxford District, having 5 chains frontage on the north-western side of the road forming the north-western boundary of Reserve 1866 (in red), and extending north-westerly 10 chains in a rectangular block, the easternmost corner being about 76 chains south-west of the junction of said road with the road forming the southern boundary of the above-mentioned Reserve. For gravel pit.

For gravel pit.
- No. 1878 (in red).—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Oxford District, having frontage to and being bounded on the north-eastward by the Eyre Road South; on the south-westward by the road forming the south-western boundary of Section 20738; and on the south-east by a line at right angles to the north-east boundary, to include the required quantity. For gravel pit.
- No. 1879 (in red).—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Oxford District, bounded on the south-westward by the road north-east of Section 19705; on the northward by the road north of that section; and on the south-eastward by a line at right angles to the road first above-mentioned, to include the required quantity. For gravel pit.
- No. 1880 (in red).—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Oxford District, having five chains frontage on the south-eastern side of Reserve 1081 (in red), and extending south-easterly ten chains in a rectangular block, the northernmost corner being about forty-seven chains south-west of Trig. Station 26. For gravel pit.
- No. 1881 (in red).—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Oxford District, having five chains frontage on the south-eastern side of Reserve 1081 (in red), and extending south-easterly ten chains in a rectangular block, the northernmost corner being eighty chains south-west of the westernmost corner of Reserve 1880 (in red). For gravel pit.
- No. 1882 (in red).—Five acres, more or less, in the Ashburton District, having five chains frontage on the road south of Section 20682, and extending northerly ten chains in a rectangular block west of and adjoining that section. For gravel pit.
- No. 1883 (in red).—Five acres, more or less, in the Ashburton District, having five chains frontage on the road forming the south-western boundary of Section 19461, and extending north-easterly ten chains in a rectangular block south-east of and adjoining that section. For gravel pit.
- No. 1884 (in red).—Five acres, more or less, situate in the Ashley District, being a rectangular block of ten chains from east to west, and five chains from north to south, the northern boundary being parallel to and about fourteen chains fifty links distant from the northern boundary

of Section 22799, and the eastern boundary being four-and-a-half chains east of the western boundary of the same section. For road purposes.

- No. 1885 (in red).—One acre, more or less, situate at Kaituna, bounded on the southward by the Kaituna Bridge Road; on the northward by a line parallel to the southern boundary, and two-and-a-half chains distant therefrom; on the eastward by the Kaituna River; and on the westward by a line at right angles to the aforesaid road, so as to contain the above quantity. BY-LAWS OF THE CANTERBURY PUBLIC DOMAINS BOARD.

HIS Honor the Superintendent directs the publication of the following By-Laws relating to the Government Domain and Hagley Park, adopted by the Canterbury Public Domains Board, and approved by him.

1. The Government Domain will be open from 7 a.m. to sunset throughout the year. The Park will, until further notice, be open at all times.
2. No person shall shoot, or fish, or carry firearms, fishing rod, or tackle within the Domain or Park, except with the special permission of the Board.
3. No person shall introduce any dog, or permit, or suffer any dog to follow him or her, or to stray into the Domain, and any dog found therein may be destroyed by any person authorised by the Board. Dogs found within the Park (unless led) may also be destroyed by any person authorised by the Board.
4. No person shall carry burdens into the Domain.
5. No person shall leave empty bottles, glass, crockery, papers, remnants of food, or other litter in the Government Domain, or in the Park.
6. No meeting or assemblage of persons of any kind or for any purpose will be allowed within the Domain or Park, without the special sanction of the Board.
7. No disorderly persons, vagrants, or persons of bad repute will be allowed within the Domain or Park.
8. No person shall walk, or otherwise trespass on the borders.
9. No vehicles, except perambulators and bath chairs, will be allowed within the Domain; nor within the Park without the special sanction of the Board.
10. No person shall climb over or wilfully damage any fence or other property belonging to, or in the custody of the Board, or take or remove any wood, earth, or gravel, from the Domain or Park.
11. No person shall bathe within the limits of the Domain or Park, except in enclosures provided for that purpose.
12. No person shall sell, or offer for sale, any article of merchandise or trade, within the Domain or Park, without the special sanction of the Board.
