PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand passed in the twenty-second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "The Provincial Reserved Bills Act, 1858," it is enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been passed by the Provincial Council of any province, and shall have been reserved by the Superintendent for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon, such Bill shall not have any force or authority within the said province until the Superintendent shall signify, either by speech or message to the Provincial Council, or by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said province, that such Bill has been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor has assented to the same.

And whereas a certain Bill intituled "The Public Libraries Ordinance, 1875," was passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, and the same was reserved by the Superintendent of the said province for the assent of his Excellency the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of all powers vested in me, do hereby proclaim and declare that the aforesaid Bill

has been laid before his Excellency the Governor, and that his Excellency has assented to the same.

REGULATIONS for the Management of the Roman Catholic Cemetery, Barbadoes street, Christchurch :—

1. The Managers appointed by the Superintendent under "The Cemetery Reserve Management Ordinance, 1870," shall have the entire control and management of the said cemetery.

2. The Cemetery shall be divided into burial plots. A plan of the cemetery shall be made showing the plots as laid off, each plot having a separate number.

3. Every grave shall be at least five feet in depth, and in the event of a greater depth being desired, an extra charge of two shillings and sixpence shall be made for every additional foot

4. Persons desirous of obtaining an exclusive right for twenty-five years in any plot of ground in the cemetery for the purpose of making a grave or vault or erecting monuments, may do so at the rate of ten shillings and sixpence per square yard, or the said plot may be bought in perpetuity for the sum of twenty shillings per square yard, each plot of ground, however, shall be used only for interment according to the laws of the Roman Catholic Church.

5. Applications for plots of ground may be made to the managers or the secretary or other person authorised by them to receive the same.

6. All railings or erections of any kind, together with monuments, and inscriptions thereon, to be approved of by the managers.

7. A book shall be kept in which shall be entered the number of any plot sold, the name of the purchaser thereof, and the date of sale. A register shall also be kept of all burials in the Cemetery, which register shall be open for the inspection of the public on payment of a fee of one shilling for each inspection, if a certified copy of entry be required, the fee shall be two shillings and sixpence.

8. No purchaser of right of burial in perpetuity shall convey, assign, or transfer such right without the sanction of the managers having been first obtained, and in the event of any such transfer, a fee of ten shillings shall be paid to the Managers.

9. In all cases of intended interment, the person having the management or control of the same shall apply to the Sexton or other duly authorised person, for a warrant for such interment, which warrant shall be granted upon payment of the following fees, viz. :—

10. The whole or a part of the foregoing costs or charges may be remitted on proof being given to the satisfaction of the managers, or person deputed by them, that the person for whom application for interment is made was a pauper at the time of his or her death, and that there are not sufficient funds available for the purpose, and that no person is liable for the payment of such costs or charges.

11. Orders for interment must be given twenty-four hours prior to the time fixed for

the funeral, except in cases of epidemic diseases, when at least six working hours' notice shall be given.

12. The following particulars must accompany the order, viz.:—

- Name of deceased.
- Age.
- Size of coffin.
- Day and hour of funeral.
- If unpurchased ground.
- No. of plot (if private ground).
- Required depth (if more than five feet).

13. The person having the management or control of the funeral must be prepared with the Registrar's or Coroner's certificate of death, to be handed to the Priest previous to the interment. No interment

shall take place in this cemetery without the written consent or presence of a Roman Catholic Priest.

14. The managers will always be at liberty to abrogate, alter, or add to the present regulations as may be deemed advisable; such alterations to be published in the Provincial *Government Gazette*.

BY-LAW No. 6.

MISCELLANEOUS.

A By-law of the Council of the Borough of Timaru made under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867."

In pursuance of the 186th Section of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867" the Council of the Borough of Timaru ordain as follows:—

Any person guilty of any of the following offences omissions or neglects within the Borough of Timaru shall on being convicted of any such offence neglect or omission be liable to pay any penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

1. No person shall throw or place or leave in or upon any street or private street footway court alley or public place whatsoever any bottle or other glass filth dust dirt earth rubbish or other matter of a similar nature.

2. No person shall make or cause any unnecessary obstruction in or upon the roadway or footpath of any street or private street by allowing any vehicle or animal to remain in upon or across the same or by placing thereon any goods or material of any kind or shall fail to remove such obstructions when thereto required or shall wilfully encumber or obstruct any street or private street within the Borough in any way not herein specially described.

3. No person shall take the sole charge in any street or private street of more than two vehicles at the same time each of which shall be drawn by one horse only and not by any other animal and the horse drawing the rearmost thereof shall be attached by a sufficient rein or other fastening to the back of the foremost of such vehicles.

4. No person in charge of any vehicle in or upon any street or private street shall allow any material which may be conveyed on such vehicle to drag or trail behind the same so as to obstruct the passage or to project on either side thereof more than a distance of two feet measured horizontally from the outside of the axle of the wheel of such vehicle nor shall any person suffer any load conveyed upon any wheeled carriage truck or roller to drag or trail or hang over such carriage truck or roller to the obstruction of the thoroughfare.

5. Any person riding or driving or otherwise in charge of any horse cattle or vehicle in or upon any street or private street shall keep to the near side thereof and any person so riding or driving or otherwise in charge

of any horse cattle or vehicle as aforesaid shall while he shall be so in charge remain sufficiently near to have the same under complete control.

6. Any person riding or driving any animal or vehicle in any street or private street meeting any other animal or vehicle shall keep on the near or left side of the road and passing shall keep on the off or right side of the road and shall not in any manner prevent or obstruct any other person from riding or driving as aforesaid from meeting or passing.

7. No person shall furiously or negligently ride or drive any horse cattle or vehicle in or upon any street or private street no person shall wilfully or negligently so drive cattle in any street or private street so as to cause damage or danger to any person or thing or shall in anywise misbehave in respect of the driving of cattle therein.

8. No person shall ride drive or lead any cattle cart dray waggon or carriage or wheel any barrow upon or along any footpath or side channel without permission from the Borough Council so to do.

9. No person in charge of any vehicle shall ride thereon without having and holding proper and sufficient reins attached to the animal or animals drawing the same.

10. No person shall without the authority of the Council expose or offer cattle for sale or exhibition in any street or private street not being a lawful fair or market.

11. No person shall slaughter or expose or offer for sale or have in his possession with intent to slaughter or sell as fit for human food any diseased animal or any meat fish game poultry or fruit which shall be unfit therefor.

12. No person shall keep open in or upon any street or private street any entrance or opening therefrom for access into any vault cellar or other underground place (except for the purpose of taking goods thereout or storing goods therein) nor for any longer time than shall be reasonably necessary for such purpose nor during such time as shall be so necessary without providing sufficient protection to passengers from any injury thereby nor shall any person neglect or omit to keep always in good repair any door railing or cover to or about such entrance or opening.

13. No person shall make any writing or painting upon any house building wall fence gate door or post of any kind or shall place thereon or affix thereto any placard document or thing or shall in any way deface the same without the consent of the owner or occupier thereof.

14. No person shall burn or set light to any shavings hay straw flax wood gorse cuttings or other inflammable produce or materials upon any street private street footway carriage road or open or public place without written permission from the Council so to do.

15. No person shall in any street or private street roll any cask or vessel or beat any carpet break in any horse fly any kite use any bows and arrows or play at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place or obstruct any footpath or carriage road nor shall any person maliciously deface injure or remove any door-plate bell knocker lamp or signboard or who shall wilfully disturb any inhabitant by ringing any bell or knocking at any door.

16. No person shall wantonly hurt or harass any cattle passing along or being in any street or private street nor shall any person wilfully set on any dog to attack worry or put in fear any person or animal in any street or suffer any ferocious or mischievous dog of which he may be owner or have charge to be at large and unmuzzled.

17. No person shall without lawful cause or authority discharge or let off any firearms or fireworks of any kind whatever.

18. No person shall throw cast or discharge any stone stick marble bullet or missile of any kind to the damage or danger of any person or thing.

19. No person shall place or leave in or upon the bank of any creek stream or water-course any dead animal or other noxious or offensive matter or thing or shall throw cast or discharge into any creek stream or water-course any dead animal or other noxious or offensive matter or thing or any living animal with intent to drown the same or shall drown any animal therein.

20. No person shall in any street sing say or recite any profane indecent or obscene song use any profane indecent or obscene language paint draw or write any profane indecent or obscene representation figure or word or distribute or expose or offer for sale or exhibit any profane or indecent book painting drawing engraving photograph representation print or paper writing.

21. No person shall indecently expose his person in or within view of any street or private street or within view of any public thoroughfare.

22. No person having the charge of shall permit any bull stallion or entire animal to cover within public view.

23. No person shall within the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and eight o'clock at night bathe near to or within view of any street or private street or place of public resort so as to offend against decency.

24. No person shall keep or act or behave as master or mistress of or as having the care government or management of any disorderly house or house of ill-fame or shall knowingly permit any other person to keep the same or to act or behave as master or mistress thereof or as having the care government or management thereof or shall knowingly let any house or part thereof for the purpose of being so kept or used.

25. No person shall wilfully destroy or damage any building wall fence or paling or

any fixture or appendage thereto or any tree shrub or plant or any seat in any park plantation or garden the same several things or places respectively being under the control management or supervision of the Borough Council.

26. No occupier of any private yardway avenue or passage shall so neglect to keep the same properly cleaned as that any nuisance may arise therefrom.

27. No person shall destroy obstruct pollute or in any way damage any well pump water-channel or course pond reservoir or fountain whether public or private.

28. No owner or occupier of any premises shall suffer any waste or impure water or liquid matter to be or remain in or upon any place under or above ground situate therein so as to become a nuisance.

29. Any owner or occupier having a term of not less than five years to run of any premises allowing any gully or hollow place situate thereon to remain unfilled up or cleansed (as the case may be) for more than one week after notice to that effect from the Council shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings for every day thereafter during which such gully or hollow place or drain shall remain not filled up or cleansed to the satisfaction of the Council.

30. Any person selling exposing delivering or offering for sale any hay straw or coals within the Borough of Timaru without having weighed or caused the same to be weighed at some weighbridge within the said Borough licensed or provided or sanctioned for that purpose by the Timaru Borough Council or any such person refusing or omitting to produce the weight note of the load or part of a load of any such hay straw or coals sold exposed or offered for sale for the satisfaction of any Inspector appointed by the Timaru Borough Council in that behalf.

31. Any carter or other person selling exposing delivering or offering for sale on any cart or waggon any hay straw or coals without having the correct tare weight of such waggon or cart painted thereon or affixed thereto in some conspicuous place of letters not less than one inch.

32. Any carter or other person who shall refuse or omit on being requested by any purchaser or intended purchaser of any hay straw or coals to proceed with such hay straw or coals to the nearest weighbridge licensed provided or sanctioned for that purpose by the Timaru Borough Council and to have the same re-weighed at the expense of such purchaser or intended purchaser (the said purchaser in all such cases taking the said load or other quantity at the net re-weight).

33. Any carter or other person who shall refuse or omit on being requested by the purchaser referred to in the last preceding section to take to any weighbridge within the Borough appointed or licensed for the

purpose of this By-law by the Borough Council the waggon dray or cart or load vehicle after the delivery of the load for the purpose of such dray cart or other vehicle being re-weighed and the correct tare weight thereof when empty ascertained.

34. Any owner or person in charge of any weighbridge within the Borough of Timaru who shall give a false or incorrect weight of any dray cart or other vehicle or of any load or part of a load thereon.

35. All weighbridges within the Borough of Timaru shall be duly licensed in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk of the said Borough and any person keeping any weighbridge within the said Borough and not having paid the license fee of One Pound annually for such weighbridge and being unlicensed.

36. Any owner or person in charge of any weighbridge within the Borough of Timaru who shall demand or exact any greater rates than those in this section authorised to be charged from any person using or desiring to use any weighbridge

Rate chargeable for any vehicle having two wheels only Sixpence

Do do four wheels One Shilling

Provided nevertheless that the Borough Council may at any time by resolution vary the rates herein authorised to be charged and after publication in the *Provincial Government Gazette* of any such alteration the rates so altered shall be deemed to be the rates authorised under this By-law

37. The word "cattle" shall for the purpose of this By-law be deemed to include horses asses mules neat cattle sheep goats and swine of all ages and of either sex and to apply to any age of such animals alone as well as to a mob or herd.

38. The word "street" shall mean a public street and highway and shall extend to and include every road square court alley and thoroughfare within the Borough of Timaru used by carts or foot passengers not being a private street.

39. The words "private street" shall mean any road street or place within the Borough of Timaru used by vehicles and either accessible to the public from a public street or forming a common access to lands and premises separately occupied and which have not been maintained as or declared a public street.

40. The word "vehicle" shall include any wheeled carriage or cart whatever be its form or construction used in carrying persons or goods.

41. All By-laws or Regulations or parts of By-laws or Regulations (if any) heretofore in force in and for the Borough of Timaru which are inconsistent with or repugnant to the provisions hereof or in any respect deal or purport to deal with the said provisions are hereby repealed.

BY-LAW No. 7.

PRIVIES AND CESSPOOLS.

A By-law of the Council of the Borough of Timaru made under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867."

INDEX :

1. All privies &c. under control of Council
2. Notice to alter privy expense to be recovered
3. Periodical removal
4. Inspection &c.
5. Obstructing any officer of Council &c.

In pursuance of the 186th Section of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867" the the Council of the Borough of Timaru ordain as follows:—

1. All privies cesspools and house drains within the Borough of Timaru and as well within as without the premises to which the same may belong and the cleansing keeping in order and repair of all such privies cesspools and house drains shall be under the superintendence government and control of the Council.

2. The owner or occupier of any dwelling-house or other tenant within the Borough of Timaru reasonably requiring the use of a privy shall within fourteen days after notice in writing given to such owner or occupier in that behalf by the Council remove construct or alter in such manner as shall be specified in such notice a privy or privies for the use of such dwelling-house or tenement and shall at all times thereafter keep and use in such privy or privies such closet pan or pans as shall from time to time be required by the Council and in default thereof the Council shall cause such privy or privies to be provided and the expense incurred thereby shall be recovered by the Council from such owner or occupier.

3. The Council shall make such provision as it shall think fit for the periodical removal from every dwelling-house or other tenement as aforesaid within the Borough of Timaru at the expense of the owner or occupier thereof of any nightsoil dung ashes slops filth refuse or rubbish of any kind.

4. The Inspector of Nuisances for the time being appointed by the Council or any other person who may be employed by the Council for the purposes of this By-law

shall have power at all reasonable hours in the day or night to enter into or upon any building or land within the Borough for the purpose of effecting any such removal as in the last preceding section specified or of examining the condition of any privy cesspool drain or closet pan or of cleansing constructing altering or repairing the same.

5. Any person who shall obstruct any officer or other person employed by the Council in the performance of anything which such officer or other person is or may be required or authorised to do by or under this By-law or who shall commit any other breach of this By-law shall on conviction be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

REGULATION No. 10.

SWINE.

A Regulation of the Council of the Borough of Timaru made under Part VIII. of the 13th Schedule of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867."

INDEX :

1. Regulation as to keeping swine.

In pursuance of the said Schedule of the said Act the Council of the Borough of Timaru make the following Regulations that is to say:—

The portion of the Borough of Timaru in which it shall not be lawful to keep any swine shall be the following (that is to say:—

1. All that part of the Borough bounded on the east by the sea on the south at a point commencing at the south-easternmost boundary of sections numbered 28 and 33 thence continuing along the southernmost boundary of the before-mentioned sections until it meets High Street thence along William Street to the eastern boundary of reserve for pleasure grounds then northerly along Rose Street to Brown Street thence along Brown Street to the Town Belt continuing thence northerly along the town boundary to Whale's Creek continuing thence to the sea.

2. All other parts of the said Borough which now are or at the time of the keeping of any swine therein shall be within fifty feet of any private dwelling or of any public or private street within the meaning of the said Act.

3. For the purposes of this Regulation the streets mentioned in sub-section 1 of this Regulation and any street which may be or may come within sub-section 2 of this Regulation shall be construed as meaning the centre of the said streets or of any such street respectively.

REGULATION No. 11.

DRIVING OF CATTLE.

Regulation of the Council of the Borough of Timaru made under Part I. of the 13th Schedule of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867."

INDEX:

1. Regulation &c. as to driving cattle.

In pursuance of the said Schedule of the said Act the Council of the Borough of Timaru make the following Regulation that is to say:—

1. The portion of the Borough of Timaru in which it shall not be lawful to drive assist to drive or cause to be driven any cattle between the hours of eight o'clock a.m. and six o'clock p.m. shall be the following that is to say:—Great North Road at its junction with Sefton Street thence along Sefton Street to its junction with Theodocia Street thence along Theodocia Street to its junction with North Street thence along North Street to the sea (excepting in the cases in this section specified).

- (1) Oxen in yoke and horses in harness may be so driven within the said hours.
- (2) Cattle found trespassing within the Borough may be driven to the pound within the said hours.
- (3) All cattle intended for export or import may be driven within the said hours.
- (4) The word "cattle" shall for the purposes of this Regulation be deemed to include horses asses mules neat cattle sheep goats and swine of all ages and of either sex and to apply to any one of such animals driven alone as well as to a mob or herd.

REGULATION NO. 12.

CROSSINGS OVER FOOTWAYS.

A Regulation of the Council of the Borough of Timaru made under Part I. of the 13th Schedule of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867."

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1. Regulation crossings over footways &c.

In pursuance of the said Schedule of the said Act the Council of the Borough of Timaru make the following Regulation (that is to say)—

This Regulation shall apply to all crossings and footways within the Borough of Timaru whether constructed or used previous to this Regulation coming into operation or not or whether permission has been obtained from the Timaru Borough Council for such construction or use or not.

1. No crossing shall be more or less than nine feet long in the direction of the street unless the permission of the Borough Council has been first obtained.

2. All crossings shall extend over the full width of the footway and have such inclination towards the channel and be set to such gradients as the case may require.

3. Both sides of any crossing laid in any street or part of a street having stone kerbings shall be laid with straight axed dressed blue stone kerbing twelve by eight in section and not less than two feet long having at each end quadrants of two feet radius the crossing in such case shall be laid with blue stone cubes nine inches deep four inches wide and any length over fifteen inches.

4. All crossings shall be laid on a well prepared bed with materials approved by the Timaru Borough Council.
