PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation, dated the 24th day of June, 1875, a rate of one shilling in the £ was declared to be leviable in the Prebbleton District, under the provisions of the 42nd Section of "The Education Ordinance, 1873," and Henry Brake was appointed as the person to whom the said rate should be paid.

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Proclamation, now, therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Education Ordinance, 1875," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, do hereby proclaim and declare that a proportion of such rate equal to ninepence in the £ shall be paid to the said Henry Brake, on or before Saturday, the 16th day of October, 1875.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1875," it is among other things provided that the Superintendent may, under the provisions of Section 16 of the said Ordinance, declare any portion of the Province not comprised within the limits of any Educational District to be an Educational District.

Now, therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, do hereby by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare the portion of the Province hereinafter described to be an Educational District with the name and with the boundaries as are hereinafter set forth :—

LONGBEACH DISTRICT.

Commencing where the road running through Section 21580 meets the road running through Section 7201; thence along the former road to where it meets the road running through Section 6801; thence south-westerly in a straight line to the road commencing at the north-east corner of Section 14294; thence along that road to the road to the west of Section 14290; thence following along the last-mentioned road to the sea beach; thence along the sea beach to the mouth of the River Ashburton; thence northerly

along the said river to a point due east of the starting point; thence in a straight line to the starting point.
