PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Canterbury, intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1875," it is among other things provided that the Superintendent may, under the provisions of Section 16 of the said Ordinance, declare any portion of the Province not comprised within the limits of any Educational District to be an Educational District:

Now, therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare the portion of the Province hereinafter described to be an Educational District, with the name and with the boundaries as are hereinafter set forth:—

ASHBURTON FORKS EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the north-west by the Mount Somers Road Board District and a line in continuation thereof; on the south-west by the north bank of the south branch of the river Ashburton; on the east by the Ashburton Educational District to the north-west corner of Section 10283; thence along the northern boundary of the said Section to the easternmost corner thereof; thence two miles in straight line magnetic north; thence in a straight line to the south-east corner of Section 7987.

PROCLAMATION.

I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, in pursuance of the powers vested in me under the seventeenth Section of "The Education Ordinance, 1875," do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, abolish the Ashley Bank and Loburn Educational Districts.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, intituled "The Education Ordinance, 1875," it is among other things provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent to alter the boundaries of any Educational District and to divide any Educational District into two or more districts or parts of districts, or to combine two or more districts or parts of districts into one, or to add portions of any district to any adjoining district, or to add any locality not being or forming part of a district to an Educational District, and in every such case the district or districts constituted or affected thereby shall be deemed to be and shall be proclaimed as provided in the said Ordinance as newly-constituted district or districts:

Now, therefore, I, RICHARD JAMES STRACHAN HARMAN, Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the seventeenth

Section of the said before-recited Ordinance, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the districts as specified in the schedule hereunto annexed to be newly-constituted Educational Districts within the meaning of "The Education Ordinance, 1875."

ASHLEY BANK EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the south by the River Ashley; on the west by the Loburn Educational District; on the north by a line from Trig. pole 3A to the northernmost corner of Section 2885; thence by Stony Creek to where it is intersected by the southern side of the Upper Sefton Road; thence by that road to the road to the north-east of Section 2137; thence by that road and the road on the west side of Section 1976 to the River Ashley aforesaid.

LOBURN EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the north by a line drawn from the north-east corner of Section 10706 to the north-east corner of section 9018 and thence in a straight line to the Grey River; on the west by the Grey River to its junction with the Okuku River and by the latter river to its junction with the Ashley River; on the south by the Ashley River to its junction with the Makerikeri River and on the east by the Makerikeri River to the southern corner of Section 6092; thence easterly along the road forming the the eastern boundary of that Section and Section 3771 to the southern boundary of Section 8448; thence northerly in a straight line to Trig. pole 3A; and from thence in a straight line to the starting point.
