TIKOKINO RESERVE ACT, 1863.

THE attention of Applicants for Allotments in this Reserve is called to the following clauses in the Tikokino Reserve Act, viz. :—

II. In all cases in which such purchasers as aforesaid shall have taken possession of and shall have expended money on their allotments. And in all cases in which the General or Provincial Government shall

before the passing of this Act have agreed to grant to such purchasers specific allotments of land the Governor may issue to such persons respectively, Crown Grants of their respective allotments subject to the provisions of this Act.

III. Every such Grant shall be held subject to the payment of the sum of ten shillings per acre at the expiration of ten years from the date thereof with interest after the rate of ten pounds per cent. per annum payable half-yearly and such sum and interest shall be deemed to be a tax on such land and may be recovered by any Commissioner of Crown Lands or other person appointed by the Governor in that behalf as a Rate Assessment or Liability recoverable under the "Sale for Nonpayment of Rates Act 1862."

IV. Provided that application in writing be made by the parties claiming the benefit of this Act to the Commissioner of Crown Lands of the Province of Hawke's Bay within six months after the passing of this Act.

THE following Report from the Chief Provincial Surveyor is published for general information.

Napier, January 12, 1864.

SIR,—I have the honor to report now upon the surveys executed during the past half-year.

Mr. Locke, the only surveyor on the staff, has principally been employed in surveying native boundaries and in settling long pending disputes regarding them. At present he is engaged on a detail survey of the Tautane Block, in marking off into sections the lately proclaimed agricultural reserve, and in staking out all purchases and applications in that block. I beg to embrace this opportunity to subjoin for your Honor's information a list of the surveys which should be executed during the next twelve months, showing likewise the time it will probably take to one surveyor and party to carry them out.

1. Survey of 120 different sections (purchased prior to this date) of 40 acres and upwards, distributed over the whole Province. The greater portion being detached selections of military settlers, including 30 bush sections, their survey cannot take less than 14 months, as a great deal of time must be lost by the frequent shifting of camp, &c. Although the issue of Crown Grants will not be required for 3 or 4 years for the military settlers' selections, their survey should not be delayed, as the grantees make the non-survey the excuse for non-occupation.

2. The detail survey of the Ahuriri and the Mohaka Blocks will require 6 months.

3. The main roads of the Province, viz., the Te Aute, the Middle, the Porangahau, and the Taupo Road, about 170 miles, should be marked off and laid down in the maps. Survey, 5 months.

4. About 500 sections for settlers under the New Zealand Settlements Act will in all probability have to be surveyed during this year. The survey of the above will

take at least 15 months, as the natural features of the country will have to be studied carefully, to be able to select the best lines of road for the internal connection of the settlements, to fix upon the best sites for reserves, &c.

5. Estimating the survey work to accrue from selections during the year at 8 months, we arrive at a total of 48 months of field-work for one survey party.

As at present only *one* surveyor is in the employ of the Provincial Government, I beg to recommend that the services of at least two more surveyors should be secured as early as possible; or that portions of the above surveys be executed by contract, for which way of proceeding a great portion of the work is well adapted.

The increase of field work will entail likewise a proportionate increase of office work, to meet which a second draftsman should be engaged, or at least one surveyor should be added to the staff, who may be employed at times in the office.

Additional assistance in the office is the more required as within the last few days instructions have been received from Auckland requiring the forwarding in future of all Crown Grants in duplicate, independent of a copy to be filed in the Crown Lands office here.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor DONALD McLEAN, Esquire,  
Superintendent of the Province of  
Hawke's Bay, in the Colony of  
New Zealand.

WHEREAS by Section No. 9 of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," passed by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, it is enacted that "If at any time it shall be made to appear to the Governor that any infectious or contagious disease has broken out in any

district out of the Colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to declare that such district is infected within the meaning of this Act, and from time to time to make such regulations as to him shall seem fit for prohibiting the importation of cattle into the Colony from such district, and the landing or driving of such cattle, and for destroying cattle imported, landed, or driven contrary to such regulations." And by Section 10 of the same Act it is also enacted that "If at any time it shall be made to appear to the Governor that any infectious or contagious disease has broken out amongst cattle in any district of the Colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to declare that such district is infected within the meaning of this Act, and from time to time to make such regulations for destroying diseased cattle therein, and for prohibiting the removal or transportation of cattle from one part of the Colony to another, and for preventing the further spread of such disease, as to him shall seem fit." And it is by the same Act also enacted that the Governor in Council may by Warrant under his hand from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the Colony all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he may think fit, and may from time to time rescind such delegation. And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to me, Donald McLean, Esquire, so long as I shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, the several powers vested in the Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act is provided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made.

Now, therefore, I, the said Donald McLean, Esquire, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, *Do Hereby Proclaim and Declare* that, after the date hereof the several Colonies of Australia—that is to say the Colony of Victoria, the Colony of New South Wales, the Colony of Queensland, the Colony of South Australia, and the Colony of Western Australia, as well as the Colony of Tasmania, as well as from all the ports situate in the Colony of New Zealand, and the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, and the Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the above-mentioned Act, and that no cattle after the date hereof, until further notice, shall be imported into the Province of Hawke's Bay from such districts: Provided, how-

ever, that the Superintendent of the Province may allow any cattle to be landed from vessels from the Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, subject to such conditions and restrictions as he may deem expedient and the circumstances of any cases may require.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING DELEGATION OF POWERS TO SUPERINTENDENTS UNDER "DISEASED CATTLE Act, 1861."

At the Government House, at Auckland, the First day of October, 1861.

Present:—

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by Warrants under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the Governor has, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to the Superintendents respectively of the Provinces of Auckland, Taranaki; Wellington, Hawke's Bay, Nelson, Marlborough, Canterbury, Otago, and Southland, certain powers conferred on him by the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," subject to certain Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, under the recited Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, by virtue of the authority given to him by the 14th section of the above-recited Act, doth hereby make and ordain the following Regulations:—

1. The delegation of Powers under the said Warrants shall continue to be in force for the period of one year from this date, subject to be rescinded according to the provisions of the above-recited Act.

2. Each Superintendent shall, immediately after exercising any of the Delegated Powers, notify the same to the Governor, and he shall transmit to the Governor particulars of all Appointments, and copies of all Regulations made by him.

3. He shall, so soon as conveniently can be, notify all Regulations made by him to the Colonial Secretary, or Chief Secretary of each of the Australian Colonies, and cause the same to be published in England in the *Times* newspaper.

4. In the exercise of powers delegated under the 9th Section of the said Act, the Superintendent of any Province may, either in the first instance, or afterwards, from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the Province, except out of any District proclaimed as infected under the said Act, any Port or place within the limits of such District, and every such excepted Port and Place shall be deemed not to

be within the proclaimed District; and the Superintendent may also from time to time by Proclamation as aforesaid rescind any Proclamation of an infected District wholly or as to any part thereof, and also the Proclamation of any such exception as aforesaid.

5. In the exercise of powers delegated under the 10th Section of the Act, the Superintendent of any Province may prohibit the importation, either by land or by sea, of Cattle into such Province from any other Province, or any particular Port or place in any other Province, or across the borders of a Province, or any particular part thereof.

6. In all such last-mentioned cases, such Superintendent shall cause notice as speedily as possible of such prohibition to be given to the Superintendent of the Province from which importation shall be prohibited, and also to the Governor.

7. The Superintendent of any Province may in his discretion, suspend or forbear to exercise all or any of the powers delegated to him under the said Act.

8. The Superintendent of each Province shall as soon as can be after the commencement of each sitting of the Provincial Council of such Province, lay before such Council copies and particulars of all appointments, regulations, acts, and proceedings whatever, issued, made, or done by him under the delegated powers of the said Act.

9. If the Provincial Council of any Province shall by resolution declare their dissent from all or any of such appointments, regulations, acts, and proceedings, such resolutions shall be forthwith transmitted by the Speaker to the Governor for his consideration.
