Present:—His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS, by the "Militia Act 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, Militia Districts. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers vested in him, doth hereby constitute the territory comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of fifteen miles from the junction of the Manga-aruhe river with the Wairoa river, a Militia District, to be called by the name following, that is to say, the Wairoa District.
