PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor JOHN DAVIES ORMOND,
Superintendent of the Province of
Hawke's Bay, in the Colony of New
Zealand.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the "Highways Act, 1871," passed by the Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay, it is provided that the Superintendent may, for the purposes of the Act, from time to time, by proclamation, divide the Province or any part thereof into districts; and whereas it is expedient to bring certain districts in the Province of Hawke's Bay under the operations of the said Act.

Now, therefore, I, John Davies Ormond, Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, in virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that every of the several areas of land described in the Schedule to this Proclamation as the boundaries thereof severally are laid down in each Schedule, shall form a separate Highway District within the terms and meaning of the said "Highway Act, 1871," viz.:—

Peka Peka and Patoka Districts.

Starts at the junction of the Tutaekuri River with the Mangaone; thence up the Mangaone to the north-western corner of Section No. 1 of Pakiaka; thence in a line bearing west to the Puketitiri Bush, and along the northern and north-western edge of that bush to its most western extremity, and thence in a line due south to the Tutaekuri River, and down that river to the starting point at the junction of the Mangaone.

Pakowhai and Waitangi Districts.

Starts at the Waitangi Bridge, follows along the main road to the north-western boundary of the Taumatua Block, and along the boundary of that block, on the sea beach, to the Waitangi, and down the Waitangi into the Ngaruroro, and up that river to the mouth of the Tutaekuri Waimata, and up that stream to A. M'Hardy's south boundary, and along his boundary, through the Pakowhai Block, to the Te Puninga Block; thence along the boundary between the Pakowhai and the Te Puninga Blocks to the Papakura Block, and along the southern boundary of the Papakura Block to the junction of the Totara creek with the Waitangi, and down the Waitangi to the starting point at Waitangi Bridge.

Papakura District.

Starts at Tareha's Bridge, follows along the Meanee road to the Tutaekuri River, at the race-course, and up that river to the dry channel of the Tutaekuri at Pa Whakairo, and up that channel to the Tutaekuri Waimata, and down that stream to A. M'Hardy's south boundary, and follows then along his boundary fence in an easterly direction to the Te Puninga Block, and along the boundary between that block and the Pakowhai Block to the southern boundary of the Papakura Block; thence along the southern boundary of that block to the junction of the Totara Creek with the Waitangi, and down the Waitangi to the Waitangi Bridge, and thence along the eastern

boundary of the Whataangaanga Block to the starting point at Tareha's Bridge.

Pukahu Block.

Starts at the Ngaruroro River, at the south-western corner of south suburban section of Havelock, No. 8; thence along the south boundary of that section to the Te Aute road; thence along that road to the south boundary of the suburban sections of Havelock, and thence along the south side of the road forming the boundary of these sections to the Middle road at the south-eastern corner of suburban section 39, and thence along the Middle road to the southern extremity of the Pukahu Block, at Forster's Gorge, and thence in a straight line along the boundary of the Kao Kaoroa Block and the Pukahu Block to the Awanui, across that stream to the Te Aute road, along that road to the Awanui, at Long Bridge, and down that stream to the Ngaruroro, and down the Ngaruroro to the starting point.

Havelock District.

Starts at the Ngaruroro River, at the north-western boundary of the Havelock suburban lands; thence follows up that river to the south-western corner of south suburban section of Havelock, No. 8; thence along the southern boundary of that section to the Te Aute road, and along that road to the southern boundary of the suburban sections of Havelock, and thence along the south side of the road forming the boundary of those sections to the Middle road at the south-eastern corner of suburban section 39, and thence along the south-western boundary of the suburban sections to the south-west angle of those sections; thence along the east and north east boundaries of Havelock township to the starting point at the Ngaruroro River.

Mohaka District.

Starts at the sea coast, at the mouth of the Waikare River; follows up that river to the mouth of the Waitahuna; thence in a line due north to the Mohaka River, and down that river to the sea, and along the sea shore to the starting point at the mouth of the Waikare.

Wainui and South Porangahau District.

Starting at the mouth of the Porangahau River, following along the sea coast to the mouth of the Waimata; thence up that stream to its source; thence in a line due north to the northern boundary of the Taunane Block, and along that boundary in an easterly direction to the bridle track to Porangahau, and along that bridle track to the Porangahau River, and down that river to the starting point.

Patangata District.

Starts at Patangata Bridge over the Papanui, follows along the west boundary of the Middle Road to its crossing of the Tamamu-Kaikora Road, and thence along the north boundary of that road to the Tuki Tuki, down that river to the mouth of the Papanui, and up that stream to the starting point at Patangata Bridge.

Kauranaki District.

Starts at the northern boundary of block 8, Te Mata District, at the Middle Road, follows along that line of road in a south-westerly direction to the Kaokaora Block;

thence along the north-eastern boundary of that block to the Whenuakura Block, and along the boundary line between both blocks to the Te Mahanga North Block; thence along the western boundary of the Kaokaora Block to its south-western corner; thence along the southern boundary of same block to the Paramahonga stream, and down that stream to the Tuki Tuki River, up that river to the mouth of the Hawea stream, following up that stream to the Waimarama Block, along the western and the north-western boundary of that block to the Okaihau Block to the south-east corner of block 12, Kidnapper District; thence follows the southern boundary of that block to the Mangarara stream; thence down that stream to the Tuki Tuki, and down that river to the boundary of the Te Mata Road District on block 9, Te Mata; thence to the south-eastern corner of suburban sections of Havelock, and along the southern and south-western boundary of those sections to the starting point at the Middle Road.

East Waipawa District.

Starts at the south-east corner of block 16, Patangata District, on the Waipawa River, follows along the eastern boundary of that block to the Te Aute road, and along the north boundary of that road to its junction with Tamamu road at Kaikora, along the north boundary of that road to its crossing of the Tuki Tuki at Tamumu, and up the Tuki Tuki to its junction with the Waipawa, and up the Waipawa to the starting point at block 16.

Seventy-Mile Bush District.

Starting at the main road at the north boundary of Taheraiti, block No. 2, follows along the boundary of that block in a westerly and southerly direction to the old bridle track; thence along that track to Tahoraiti No. 1, following the west and south boundaries of that block to the Oringi Block along its south boundary to the old bridle track, and along that track to Matahiwi; thence along the western and southern boundaries of that block to the Manawatu River; thence up that river to the Otopo Creek, and up that creek to the south-east boundary of the Otopo Block, and along the eastern boundary of that block to the Kaitoki Block to the Mangatoro Block, and by the southern and eastern boundaries of that block to Rakautuhaka, and thence by a straight line bearing east to the western boundary of the Porangahau Block, and along the western boundary of that block in a northerly direction to the Mangapoaka road, and along the northern boundary of that road to the Manawatu River, and across that river to the northern boundary of the same road to Tahoraiti No. 2, and by the northern boundary of that block to the starting point.

West Kaikora.

Starts on the Te Aute road, at the bridge over Kaikora Creek, follows up that creek to the eastern boundary of block 15, Patangata District; thence along the northern boundary of that block to its north-west angle; thence in a straight line to the north-west angle of block 17, and thence along the western boundary of blocks 17, 19, 148, 124, 144, and 179 to the south-west corner of block 179, and along the south boundary

of blocks, 179, 18, 23, and 49, to the Te Aute road, and by that road to the starting point at Kaikora Bridge.

Tamamu and Pourerere Districts.

Starts at the junction of the Mangarara with the Tuki Tuki, follows up that river to the mouth of the Mangatarata, and up that stream to the junction with the Tangiturpera, and up that creek to the Hapuku line, and along the southern boundary lines of the runs of Messrs. Gollan and Nairn to the sea coast at Blackhead, and along the sea coast to the mouth of the Pourerere, and thence in a straight line to the head of Omakari Creek; thence follows down that creek to the south-western boundary of block 74, Mangakuri District; thence along the western boundaries of blocks 74 and 73 and the western and northern boundary of block 72 to the Mangarara, and down that stream to the starting point at the Tuki Tuki River.

West Waipawa District.

Starts from the Te Aute road at the south boundary of block 49, Patangata District, follows along the south boundary of blocks 49, 23, 18, and 179, to the south-west corner of block 179; thence along the west boundary of blocks 179 and 144 to the north-east corner of block 4, and thence along the north boundary of that block to the Mangaonuku River, and down that river to its junction with the Waipawa, and down that river to the west boundary of block 16; thence along the west and north boundaries of that block to the Te Aute road, and along that road to the starting point.

Waipukurau East.

Starts from the junction of the Mangatarata with the Tuki Tuki; follows up that stream to the junction with the Tangiturpera, and up that creek to the boundary of the Hapuku Block; thence along that line to the main South Road, following that road in a north-easterly direction to the North boundary of Captain Newman's property, and along that boundary in a westerly direction to Lake Hutuma; thence along the eastern shore of that lake to its north-eastern extremity, and thence along the boundary between Blocks 31 and 16, Waipukurau, to the Tuki Tuki; thence down that river to the starting point at the mouth of the Mangatarata.

Waipukurau West.

Starts at the Tuki Tuki river, at the boundary between Blocks 31 and 16, Waipukurau; follows along that boundary to Lake Hutuma; thence along the eastern shore of that lake to its southern extremity, at the boundary between the properties of Captain Newman and Mr. H. R. Russell; thence along that boundary to the main South Road, and along that road to the south boundary of the Hapuku Block, and along that boundary in a westerly direction to the edge of the bush at Takapau, and thence along the edge of the bush to the Makaretu river, and up that river to the south-west corner of Block 181, Ruataniwha District; thence along the western boundary of that block, and by a straight line bearing north to the

Tuki Tuki, and down that river to the starting point at Waipukurau.

Raukawa District.

Starts on the Te Aute Road at the north boundary of the Ko Parakori Block; follows the boundary of that block to the Mangaroa Block, and along the southern boundary of that block to the Raukawa East Block; thence along the northern boundary of that block, and of Raukawa West Block, to the Maraekakaho Block; thence along the east boundary of that block to the south boundary of the Te Onepu West Block; thence along the southern boundary of that block and of Te Onepu East, and Teiputaraia Block to the northern boundary of the Te Aute College land, and down that boundary to the Te Aute Road, and by that road to the starting point.

Oero District.

Starts from the junction of the Hawea stream with the Tuki Tuki; follows up that river to the mouth of the Mangarara, and up that stream to the north-western boundary of Block 76, Mangakuri District, along the southern and south-eastern boundary of Blocks 76 75, to the Mangakuri stream; thence by a straight line to the easternmost corner of Block 1A, on the southern boundary of the Kairakau Block, and along the western and south-western boundaries of the Kairakau Block, Te Apiti Block, and Waimarama Block to the Hawea stream, and down the stream to the starting point at the Tuki Tuki.

Tutaekuri and Okawa District.

Starts at the junction of the dry channel of the Tutaekuri with that river at Pawhakairo; follows up the Tutaekuri to the north-west boundary of the Okawa Block; thence along the west boundary of that block to its most southerly point; thence in a straight line, bearing south, to the Waitio, and down the Waitio to the eastern boundary of the Waipiropiro Block, and along that boundary to the dry channel of the Tutaekuri, and by it to the starting point at Pawhakairo.

Turiroa District.

Starting at the easternmost corner of Section 9, Turiroa Reserve, on the Wairoa river; thence following along the south-eastern boundary of that section, and of sections Nos. 10 and 11, to the southernmost corner of section No. 11; thence along the south-western boundary of that section to the south-eastern boundary of section 12; thence along that boundary to the eastern boundary of section No. 27; thence following along that boundary and the eastern boundary of section No. 27; thence following along that boundary and the eastern boundary of sections Nos. 38 and 35 to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the southern boundary of the same section, and of section No. 36, to the south-western corner thereof; thence following along the western boundary of the same section, and of section No. 34, to the southern boundary of

section No. 31; thence along the southern and western boundaries of that section, and the western boundary of sections Nos. 30 and 26, to the north-western corner of section No. 26; thence along the northern boundary of that section to the westernmost corner of section 24; thence following along the north-western boundary of that section, and of section No. 22, to the north-western corner of section No. 20; thence following along the northern boundary of sections Nos. 20, 18, and 37, to the north-eastern corner of section No. 37; thence along the north-eastern boundary of that section, and of section No. 13, to the Huramua stream; thence following down that stream to the Wairoa river; thence following down that river to the commencing point at the easternmost corner of section No. 9.
