Bringing the "Crown Lands Act, 1862,"

At the Government House, at Auckland,
the 28th day of February, 1863.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Crown Lands Act, 1862," it is enacted that the said Act shall come into operation in each Province of New Zealand on and from a day to be fixed by the Governor in Council, to be notified in the 'Government Gazette' of the Colony, and also of the Province to which such notification shall apply:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby order that the "Crown Lands Act, 1862," shall come into operation within each of the after-mentioned Provinces of New Zealand, namely, in the Provinces of

on and from the Sixth day of April next.
