A PROCLAMATION

*Intimating Her Majesty's Assent to certain
Bills passed by the General Assembly.*

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY,
Knight Commander of the Most
Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief
in and over Her Majesty's Colonies
of New Zealand and its Depend-
encies, and Vice Admiral of the
same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the
Session of Parliament held in the
fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her

Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to
grant a Representative Constitution to the
Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst
other things enacted that no Bill which
shall be reserved for the signification of
Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have
any force or authority within the Colony
of New Zealand until the Governor of
the said Colony shall signify by speech or
message to the Legislative Council and
House of Representatives of the said Colony,
or by Proclamation, that such Bill has
been laid before Her Majesty in Council,
and that Her Majesty has been pleased to
assent to the same :

And whereas certain Bills passed by the
Legislative Council and House of Repre-
sentatives of the said Colony, intituled

"An Act to amend the Waste Lands
Acts of the Province of Auckland :"

"An Act to amend the Regulations in

force in the Province of Marlborough for the sale and disposal of the Waste Lands of the Crown within the said Province," and

"An Act to repeal Clause 15 'Waste Lands Act, 1858,' Section VII., Clause 28 of the General Land Regulations for the sale of Waste Lands in New Zealand, proclaimed 4th March, 1853, and the Hawke's Bay Naval and Military Settlers' Act, 1861,' so far as they affect the Provinces of Wellington and Hawke's Bay."

were presented to the Governor of the said Colony for Her Majesty's assent, and the said Bills were reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the said in part recited Act, do, by this Proclamation, signify and proclaim to all whom it may concern, that the said Bills have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my hand at Government House, at Auckland, and issued under the seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this twenty-ninth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

BY HIS HONOR ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Provincial Reserved Bills Act, 1858," it is provided, whenever any Bill shall have passed the Provincial Council of any Province, and shall have been reserved by the Superintendent for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon, such Bill shall not have any force or authority within the said Province until the Superintendent shall signify, either by speech or message to the Provincial Council, or by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, that such Bill has been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor has assented to the same:

And whereas an Act for the "Prevention of Fires, 1864," and an Act for the "Regulation of the Police Force of the Province of Marlborough, 1864," were passed by the Provincial Council of Marlborough during their eighth Session, but were respectfully reserved for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon.

Now, therefore, I, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, do hereby proclaim and notify that the above-mentioned Acts, having been duly laid before His Excellency the Governor, and the Governor having assented to the same, are, under the provisions of the said recited Act of the General Assembly, in full force and authority within the Province of Marlborough from the date of this Proclamation.
