TOWN OF PICTON.

All those Allotments in the Town of Picton, being sections numbered respectively 499, 500, 501, 502, 503, 504, 505, 515, 523, 524, 530, 616, 957, 958, 959, 965, 967, 969, 971, 973, 975, 977, 979, 981, 983, 985, 989, 991, 993, 995, 997, 999, on the plan of the said town, containing by admeasurement, eight acres for Railway Purposes.

TOWN OF HAVELOCK.

All those Allotments in the Town of Havelock, being sections numbered respectively 57, 61 and 65 on the plan of the said town, containing by admeasurement, five acres, one rood, and twenty-two perches, for Public Buildings.

VILLAGE OF TUAMARINA.

Estimated Extent, about 150 acres.

All that Block of Land at West Head, entrance of Tory Channel, bounded on the north-east and west by the sea, and on the south by land granted to J. Toms.

Estimated Extent, about 150 acres.

All that Block of Land at Point Deiffenbach, bounded on the north, east, and west by the sea, and on the south partly by section No. 43 and Crown Land, being a straight line from coast to coast.

Estimated Extent, about 90 acres.

All that Block of Land at Heaphy Point, Arapawa Island, bounded on the north by a line starting from a point 25 chains along the coast north of Heaphy Point, and bearing east until it intersects opposite coast, and on the east, south, and west, by the sea.

Estimated Extent, about 100 acres.

An Island in Tory Channel, off Point Kaihinui, called Mochoibo.

Estimated Extent, about 3 acres.

All that Block of Land at Wedge Point, bounded on the north, east, and south, by the sea and on the west by Crown Land, being a straight line bearing north from coast to coast.
