PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by Act of the Provincial Council of the Province of Wellington, Session IX., No. 10, intituled "An Act to amend and consolidate the Law relating to District Highways," it was enacted among other things that the Superintendent might for the purposes of the said Act from time to time by Proclamation divide the Province or any part thereof into districts, and might in like manner subdivide, alter, or reunite the same. AND WHEREAS it is expedient to proclaim the portion of the Province hereinafter mentioned to be comprised within a District for the purposes of said Act. NOW THEREFORE I, ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington in virtue of the power and authority in me vested in this behalf, Do HEREBY proclaim and declare that all that piece

of Land situate in and being bounded on the North by an East and West line from the North West corner of section number One hundred and seventy eight to the Pahautanui Small Farm Block, East by the River Hutt, and South and West by the boundaries of the District known as the Western Hutt District, as already proclaimed, and also by the boundary of the Horokiwi Road District, the Takapu District and the Pahautanui District, to the above mentioned Small Farm Block, and more particularly delineated by the plan drawn hereon, shall form and constitute a portion of the District already proclaimed and commonly known as the Western Hutt District, for the purposes of the District Highways' Act.

Given under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Wellington, at Wellington, this tenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

NEW ZEALAND, PROVINCE OF
NELSON.
FIXED LIGHT ON BOULDER BANK,
BLIND BAY.

HIS Honor the Superintendent directs it to be notified, that on the night of MONDAY, the fourth day of August next and every night thereafter, from the going away of daylight in the evening to the return of daylight in the morning, a Light will be exhibited from the undermentioned Lighthouse, the position and characteristics of which have been specified by John Blackett, Esq., Engineer, and James Smith Cross, Harbor Master, of the Province of Nelson, as follows:—

NELSON HARBOR LIGHT, BLIND BAY.

Nelson Lighthouse is situated on the S.W. end of the Boulder Bank, ten miles S.S.W. of Pepin Island, and half a mile N. and by E. of the Powder Magazine. The Light will be Catadioptric of the fourth order, a fixed White Light,

and will be exhibited from an octagonal Tower of Iron, painted white, erected on the Boulder Bank. The Light will be about sixty (60) feet above high water of spring tides, and will be seen in clear weather at a distance of about twelve and a half ($12\frac{1}{2}$) nautical miles, allowing ten (10) feet for the height of the eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The Lighthouse is situated in Latitude, $41^{\circ} 15' 5''$ South. Longitude, $173^{\circ} 17' 7''$ East, with the following bearings.

Compass Bearings to Light, which illuminates an arc of $119\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$.

The Light will be visible from W. by S. westerly, round by north to N. and by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.

From off Croixilles Harbor—

S. $19\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., or S. and by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.

From off Extreme End of the Sand Spit off Cape Farewell—

S. $26\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., or S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. Easterly.

From Waimea West—

N. 80° E., or E. and by N. Easterly.

The Outer Anchorage—The Light bearing East South East. 6 fathoms low water.

CAUTION.—Masters of Vessels are cautioned not to shut the Light in, nor to approach within one (1) mile of the point upon which the Lighthouse is erected.

SIR,—I have the honor to forward you herewith a copy of the conditions under which the Provincial Government of Wellington will be prepared to receive tenders for the Loan of £25,000 authorised to be raised by Act of the Provincial Council, Session IX., No. 11.

The tenders will be received and opened in the office of the Superintendent of the Province on Saturday, the 25th of October next at noon, and any tenders not presented at that hour will necessarily be excluded from the competition.

CONDITIONS.

1st. Tenders will be received for the whole or any portion of the Loan, provid-

ing that the amount tendered for be not less than One Thousand Pounds stg. (£1000). All tenders to be presented at the appointed time by the person or persons tendering, or some person duly qualified to act on his or their behalf, such tenders to be opened and the rates and amounts declared, in the presence of the persons by whom they are presented.

2nd. The amount of the accepted tender or tenders, with the premium thereon, will be required to be paid to the Provincial Treasurer in Wellington, in Cash, on the 1st day of January, 1863.

3rd. The Provincial Government will fix the *minimum* at which they will accept tenders, and will have the same enclosed in a sealed envelope, to be opened in the presence of the parties tendering, as soon as the various tenders shall have been opened, and all tenders at rates below such *minimum* will be rejected.

4th. Each tender to have the amount tendered for and the rate of premium described in words at length, as well as in figures.

5th. The highest tender above the *minimum* rate as fixed by the Provincial Government will be accepted, but if it should not be for the whole amount of the Loan, then the next highest will be taken in addition to the former, and so on until the whole sum of £25,000 shall have been taken.

6th. Should the last tender accepted, when added to the amounts of the tenders previously accepted, make a larger sum than £25,000 (exclusive of premium) then only so much of such tender will be accepted as shall make up the aforesaid sum of £25,000.

7th. Should there be two or more tenders at the same rate, which together, if the highest tenders, or if not the highest, when added to the tenders previously accepted, shall make more than the sum of £25,000. then the whole sum, or such portion thereof as has not previously been taken, shall be allotted to the parties tendering at the same rate, in proportion to the sums tendered for by them respectively, provided always that such proportions be as nearly equal as they can be consistently with being in sums divisible by one hundred pounds (£100) without remainder.

8th. As the debentures and coupons bear date the 1st of July, 1862, the first coupon will be removed previous to the issue of the debentures.

9th. Should only a portion of the whole sum be tendered for at rates above the *minimum*, the Provincial Government will reserve the right of rejecting the

whole of the tenders, should they deem it expedient to do so.
