WARRANT ABOLISHING A PRINCIPAL  
POLLING PLACE, AND APPOINTING  
ANOTHER IN LIEU THEREOF.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY,  
Knight Commander of the Most Ho-  
norable Order of the Bath, Governor  
and Commander-in-Chief in and over  
Her Majesty's Colony of New Zea-  
land and its Dependencies, and Vice-  
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME,  
GREETING :—

**W**HEREAS by "The Regulation of  
Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that  
it shall be lawful for the Governor by Warrant  
under his hand, from time to time, to appoint  
polling places for each electoral district, within  
or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any  
one of such places to be the principal polling  
place for the district, and all or any of such  
polling places at any time to abolish and to  
appoint other polling places in lieu thereof ;

And whereas by Warrant under the hand of  
the Governor, bearing date the sixteenth day of

July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-  
three, the

COURT HOUSE, Blenheim,  
was appointed a Principal Polling Place for the  
District of Lower Wairau, for the Election of  
Members of the Provincial Council of the Pro-  
vince of Marlborough ;

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the  
same, and to appoint another in lieu thereof :

Now know ye, that I, Sir George Grey, the  
Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of  
the power and authority in me vested by the said  
Act, do hereby abolish the above-named principal  
polling place for the District of Lower Wairau,  
for the election of Members of the Provincial  
Council of the Province of Marlborough, and do  
appoint in lieu thereof
