WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the
Legislative Council of New Zealand,
intituled "An Ordinance to authorise and
regulate the Impounding of Cattle," the
Governor is empowered by notification
in the *Government Gazette*, from time to
time, to increase, reduce, or otherwise vary
the fees and charges under the said Ordinance,
as occasion may require: And
whereas such power within the Province of
Marlborough is now vested in the Superintendent
thereof.

Now therefore, I, WILLIAM HENRY EYES,
Esquire, the Superintendent of the Province
of Marlborough, do hereby proclaim and
declare that, from the date hereof, the
Fees payable, and the charges for food to
be made at the "Picton Pound," shall be
as follows, that is to say:—
