PROCLAMATION.

By his Honour Arthur Penrose Seymour, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough in the Colony of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS, by Clause III. of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, by proclamation, to constitute and appoint any portion of the colony to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the said act, and the limits of such Gold Field from time to time to alter as occasion may require; and also if he shall see fit, to revoke such proclamation.

And whereas, by a Warrant bearing date the Fourth day of May, 1870, under the hand of his Excellency the Governor, the said recited power, so far as regards the Province of Marlborough, was delegated to me, Arthur Penrose Seymour, the Superintendent of the said province: and whereas it is expedient that a certain portion of the Province of Marlborough should be constituted a Gold Field.

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Penrose Seymour, Superintendent of the Province of

Marlborough, do hereby constitute and appoint a Gold Field under the provisions of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," to be called the "Wairau Gold Field," the boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—Towards the West—The river Goulter to the junction of Ward's Pass Creek, and thence by that creek to its source; towards the East—The trunk line of road from the river Wairau towards Havelock; towards the South—The river Wairau, and towards the North—The summit of the dividing range between the Pelorus and Wairau Valleys, so as to include all the watershed of the river Wairau between the before-mentioned East and West boundaries, excepting the freehold lands within these boundaries.

## PROCLAMATION.

By his Honour Arthur Penrose Seymour, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough in the Colony of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS, by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," the Governor is empowered to make Regulations for any Gold Field and to alter and revoke the same: and whereas by a Warrant under the hand of his Excellency the Governor, bearing date the Fourth day of May, 1870, the said recited power within the Province of Marlborough was delegated to me, Arthur Penrose Seymour, the Superintendent of the said province.

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Penrose Seymour, the Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, do hereby revoke all regulations made in pursuance of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," now in force in the Province of Marlborough, and do hereby appoint and declare that the Gold Field Regulations now in operation in the South West Gold Fields of the Province of Nelson shall be in force within the limits of the Pelorus and Wairau Gold Fields in the said Province of Marlborough.
