PROCLAMATION.

By his Honour Arthur Penrose Seymour, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Colony of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by Clause IV. of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause a document to be called "The Miner's Right" to be issued to any person applying for the same on payment of the sum of twenty shillings; and whereas by a Warrant bearing date the Fourth day of May, 1870, his Excellency the Governor delegated the said recited power to me, Arthur Penrose Seymour, the Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, to have, hold, and exercise the same within the Province of Marlborough.

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Penrose Sey-

mour, the Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, do hereby appoint that

JAMES BALFOUR WEMYSS, Esquire, shall issue, at the office of the Provincial Secretary, in the Town of Blenheim, a "Miners Right," in the form set forth in schedule A to the said Act annexed, to any person who shall apply for the same, on payment of the sum of Twenty shillings.
