PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Provincial Reserved Bills Act, 1858," it is enacted that whenever any Bill shall have passed the Provincial Council of any Province, and shall have been reserved for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon, such Bill shall not have any force or authority within the said Province, until the Superintendent shall signify either by speech or message to the Provincial Council, or by proclamation in the Government Gazette of the said Province, that such Bill has been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor has assented to the same.

And whereas the following Bills intituled respectively—

- "The Education Act Amendment Act, 1872,"
- "The Fairhall, Renwick, and Omaka Road Diversion Act,"
- "The Roads Act, 1872,"
- "The Appropriation Act, 1872,"

"The Scab Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1872," and

"The Provincial Representation Act, 1872,"

were passed by the Provincial Council of the Province of Marlborough, but were reserved for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon:—

Now, therefore, I, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, the Superintendent of the said Province of Marlborough, do hereby proclaim and declare that the above-mentioned Bills having been duly laid before His Excellency the Governor, and the Governor having assented to the same, will, under the provisions of the said recited Act of the General Assembly, be in full force and authority within the Province of Marlborough from the date of the publication of this proclamation.

PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Colony of New Zealand.

IN pursuance of the powers delegated to me under the authority of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," and "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," by his Excellency the Governor in Council, on the 4th day of May, 1870, I, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, the Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, do hereby declare and proclaim that, on and after the day next after the day on which this Proclamation shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, the several Colonies of Australia, that is to say, the Colonies of Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, and Western Australia, and the Colony of Tasmania, shall be deemed to be Infected Districts within the meaning of the said Acts.

Any person desirous of importing Sheep by land or sea into the Province of Marlborough, shall be required to hold a clean certificate from an Inspector in the Province or Colony whence they come, or to make a declaration in writing to an Inspector of the Province of Marlborough, that the said Sheep shall have been free from Scab for a period of three months ; and the Inspector, when satisfied of their freedom from Scab, shall give a certificate in the form of Schedule B. : Provided that all Sheep that have strayed over the boundary of the Province may be brought back to their run in accordance with Clause 44.

Regulation to alter Chief Inspector's Report from three to six months :—

The time mentioned in Clause 28 for Inspector to send Return to Chairman, is hereby altered from three to six months —viz., 30th November, and 31st May.
