PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by Clause XI. of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," the Governor is empowered to make Regulations for any Gold Field and to alter and revoke the same: And whereas by a warrant under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date the Fourth day of May, 1870," the said recited power within the Province of Marlborough was delegated to me, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, as Superintendent of the said Province: And whereas it is expedient to make Regulations for "The Queen Charlotte Sound Gold Field" in the said Province.

Now therefore I, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, the Superintendent as aforesaid, do hereby make the Regulations herein-

after named for the Queen Charlotte Sound Gold Field in the said Province, that is to say—

The Regulations now in force within the Pelorus, Wairau, and Ravenscliff Gold Fields in the Province of Marlborough.

And I do further appoint and declare that the said Regulations shall have full force and effect within the limits of the said Queen Charlotte Sound Gold Field from the date of this Proclamation.

Given under my hand at Wellington, this 22nd day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and issued under the Seal of the said Province of Marlborough, at Blenheim.

WHEREAS by Clause III of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by proclamation to constitute and appoint any portion of the Colony to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the said Act, and the limits of such Gold Field from time to time to alter as occasion may require: And whereas by a warrant bearing date the Fourth day of May, 1870, under the hand of his Excellency the Governor, and the public seal of the Colony, the said recited power within the Province of Marlborough was delegated unto me, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province: And whereas it is expedient to extend the limits of the Pelorus Gold Field in the said Province.

Now, therefore, I, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, the Superintendent as aforesaid, do by this proclamation extend the limits of the said Gold Field, so that the same shall include:

All that portion of the said Province which is bounded towards the North by Paul's Run from the summit of the range between the Pelorus and Kaituna Valleys to the South-eastern corner of Section 77, Pelorus Valley; thence towards the North by the said section to its South-western corner; thence by a right line to the South-eastern corner of Section 58, Pelorus Valley; thence by that section to its South-western corner; thence by a right line to the South-eastern corner of Section 1, Pelorus Valley; thence by the Southern boundary of that section to the Watershed of the Wakamarina River; thence towards the West by the said Watershed to the summit of the dividing range between the Pelorus and Kaituna Valleys, and towards the South and East by the said summit to the starting point.

WHEREAS by Clause III. of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation, to constitute and appoint any portion of the Colony to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the said Act, and the limits of such Gold Field from time to time to alter as occasion may require: And whereas by a warrant bearing date the Fourth day of May, 1870, under the hand of his Excellency the Governor, the said recited power so far as regards the Province of Marlborough, was delegated to me, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Superintendent of the said Province: And whereas it is expedient to alter the limits of the Wairau Gold Field in the said Province:

Now therefore, I, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, the Superintendent as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that a line parallel with, and three miles to the north of, the North Bank of the River Wairau, shall be, on and after the day on which this proclamation shall be published, the Southern boundary of the Wairau Gold Field aforesaid, instead of the River Wairau as declared by a certain proclamation given under my hand, and issued under the seal of the said Province on the Twentieth day of May, 1870.

PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by Clause 13 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," it is enacted that the Superintendent of the Province in which any single Borough is situate may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one fourth of the number of persons liable

to be rated in respect of property in such Borough, by proclamation, divide such Borough into three separate wards by such names, and with such boundaries respectively, as shall by such Proclamation be assigned to the same.

And whereas a Petition, signed by one-fourth of the persons liable to be rated in respect of property within the Borough of Blenheim, in the Province of Marlborough, praying that the said Borough may be divided into Wards, has been received by me:

Now therefore I, ALTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, the Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough do by this Proclamation divide the said Borough into three separate Wards, to be called respectively "The North Ward," "The East Ward," and "The West Ward," the boundaries whereof shall be as follows, that is to say:

The North Ward.

Bounded towards the North by a Public Road forming the Northern boundary of Sections 51 and 50 Omaka from the North Western Corner of said Section 51 to the Opawa River; thence towards the East by the Opawa River to the boundary line between sections 47 and 24 Opawa, thence by that line to the Opawa River; thence towards the South by the Opawa and Omaka Rivers to the Western boundary of Section 3 Omaka; and thence towards the West by the Western boundary of said Section 3 and the Western boundary of said section 51 to the starting point.

The East Ward.

Bounded towards the North by the Opawa and Omaka Rivers from the North Eastern corner of Section 46 Opawa to the Omaka Bridge, thence by Alfred-street to Market Place, thence towards the West by Market Place to the Maxwell Road, thence by the Maxwell Road to the Southern boundary of Section 3 Omaka; thence towards the South by the Southern boundaries of Sections 3 and 1 Omaka to the South Eastern corner of said Section 1; thence by a Public Road along the Eastern boundary of said Section 1 to the South Western corner of Section 46 Opawa; thence the Southern Boundary of said Section 46 by to its South Eastern corner; thence towards the East by the Eastern boundary of said Section 46 to the Opawa River.

The West Ward.

Bounded towards the North by the Omaka River from the Western boundary of Section 3 Omaka to the Omaka Bridge;

thence towards the South by Alfred-street to Market Place; thence towards the East by Market Place to the Maxwell Road; thence by the Maxwell Road to the Southern boundary of Section 3 Omaka; thence towards the South by the Southern boundary of said Section 3 to its South Western corner; and thence towards the West by the Western boundary of said Section 3 to the Omaka River.
