PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Colony of New Zealand.

IN pursuance of the power vested in me, I, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, the Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, do hereby Summon the Provincial Council of the said Province to meet in the Council Chamber, Blenheim, at Three o'clock in the afternoon on FRIDAY, the Twenty-ninth day of May instant, and do proclaim that the Twenty-sixth Session of the said Council shall commence at the said time and place accordingly.

PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS, by Clause III. of "The Goldfields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by proclamation to constitute and appoint any portion of the Colony to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the said Act, and the limits of such Gold Field from time to time to alter as occasion may require: And whereas the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, did, on the Thirtieth day of March, 1874, delegate the said recited power unto me, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Esquire, as Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, to have, hold, and exercise within the said Province: And whereas, it is expedient to alter the limits of "The Wairau Gold Field" in the said Province:

Now therefore I, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, the Superintendent as aforesaid, do by this Proclamation, appoint that the

boundaries hereinafter mentioned shall henceforth be the limits of "The Wairau Gold Field" aforesaid, instead of the boundaries defined in a Proclamation bearing date the Twentieth day of May, 1870 (private lands having been declared to be exempt by a Proclamation bearing date the Twenty-third day of January, 1871), and altered by a Proclamation bearing date the Nineteenth day of November, 1872, which said proclamations were given under my hand, and issued under the seal of the said Province;—

Commencing at the saddle called "Ward's Pass"; thence by Ward's Pass Stream to its junction with the river Goulter; thence by the North-western and North-eastern boundaries of the Mount Patriarch Run to the North-western corner of the North Bank Run; thence by the Northern boundary of that Run to the North-western boundary of the "Hillersden Cattle Run"; thence by a right line to the Eastern corner of the run applied for by Henry George Bell; thence by Quartz Creek to Bartlett's Creek; thence by that creek and the boundary of Langley Dale Run to the most Northern corner of the said run; thence by a right line to the North-western corner of Section Number 134, Onamalutu Valley; thence by that line continued in the same direction to a point one mile distant from the trunk line of road through the Kaituna Valley; thence by a right line due North magnetic to the watershed between the Onamalutu and Kaituna Valleys; thence by that watershed to the summit of the ranges between the Wairau and Pelorus Valleys; thence by that summit to the boundary of the Province to Ward's Pass Saddle, excepting all Freehold, Leasehold, and Private Lands, and lands held under Depasturing Licenses within the aforesaid boundaries.

PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by "The Hawke's Bay and Marlborough Rivers Act, 1868," (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act") and "The Hawke's Bay and Marlborough Rivers Acts Amendment Act, 1872," it is enacted that upon the petition of the owners or occupiers of not less than three-fourths of the annual value of the rateable property, as in the said Act provided, of any District defined in such petition, any part of the Province intersected or bounded by any river from the overflow of which damage may be apprehended, the Superintendent shall by proclamation in the *Provincial Gazette* declare that the said Act shall come into operation within such part of the Province, and shall also by such proclamation define the boundaries of the same, and declare the same to be a District under the said Act, and shall also fix the name by which such District shall be known, and also in such proclamation shall determine the number of Conservators who are to constitute the Board for such District, but in no case shall the number be less than five nor more than seven.

And whereas the petition of the owners and occupiers of three-fifths of the annual value of the rateable property, as in the said Act provided, within the District hereinafter described has been received by me: And whereas damage from the overflow of the river Opawa bounding the said District is apprehended:

Now, therefore, I, ARTHUR PENROSE SEYMOUR, the Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, do hereby proclaim and declare that "The Hawke's Bay and Marlborough Rivers Act, 1868," shall come into operation within that part of the Province of Marlborough which is situate within the boundaries hereinafter set forth, and do further proclaim and declare the same to be a District under the said Act, to be known as "The Lower Wairau District," and that the number of Conservators who are to constitute the Board for such District shall be Five.

THE LOWER WAIRAU DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the West by the River Waihopai from the South-western corner of "The Delta Run" to the junction of the said river with the river Wairau; thence towards

the North and North-west, partly by the river Wairau, and partly by "The Spring Creek District" under the said Act, to the river Wairau at the North-eastern end of the road between sections 28 and 32, Wairau West; thence towards the North and East by the river Wairau and the Mud Flats to the Eastern boundary of section 18, Opawa; thence by that boundary to the South eastern corner of said section 18, Opawa; thence towards the South by the Southern boundaries of sections 18, 20, 23, and 26, Opawa, to section 27, Opawa; thence by part of the Southern and Western boundaries of said section 27 to section 30, Opawa; thence by the Southern boundaries of sections 30, 32, 34, 36, 38, Opawa, to the South-western corner of the said section 38; thence by a right line to the North-eastern corner of section 43, Opawa; thence by the Northern boundary of that section to a public road at the North-western corner of said section 43; thence towards the West by that Public Road to the South-eastern corner of allotment numbered 47 on the plan of the subdivision of section 2, Omaka; thence by a right line to the North-western corner of allotment numbered 36 on the said plan; thence towards the West by Scott-street on the said plan to Walter-street in the Borough of Blenheim; thence by Walter-street to Frances street in the said Borough; thence towards the South by Frances-street to allotment 598; thence by the South-western boundaries of allotments 598, 597, 596, and 417, to the Maxwell Road in the said Borough; thence by a right line to the North-eastern corner of allotment 391; thence by the Northern boundaries of allotments 391, 565, and 564; thence by the division line between allotments 563 and 564 to allotment 566; thence by the Southern boundaries of allotments 563 and 562 to Poynter-street in the said Borough; thence by a right line to the centre of the street frontage of allotment 559; thence by a right line to the division line between allotments 554 and 555; thence by that line to Percy-street in the said Borough; thence by a right line to the North-eastern corner of allotment 572; thence by Dillon-street in the said Borough to section 5, Omaka; thence by a right line to the South-eastern corner of said section 5;

thence by the Southern boundaries of sections 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15, 17, and 19, Omaka, to the South-western corner of said section 19; thence by the Western boundary of said section 19 to a public road at the North-western corner of said section 19; thence by that public road to the South-western corner of section 61, Omaka; thence by a public road between sections 61, 62, and 166, Omaka, to the North-eastern corner of said section 62; thence by a public road passing along the Northern boundary of said section 62, intersecting section 167, Omaka, and along the Northern boundary of section 164, Omaka, to the North-eastern corner of section 163, Omaka; thence by the Northern boundary of said section 163, to a public road at the North-western corner of said section 163; thence by a public road (forming the Western boundary of said section 163) towards the river Opawa to a point on the last-mentioned road 2,000 links from the present bank of the river Opawa; thence by a line parallel to and 2,000 links from the bank of the river Opawa until it intersects the Southern boundary of section 172, Omaka; thence by the Southern boundary of said section 172 to the Delta Run; thence by the Southern and Eastern boundaries of the said run to its South-western corner at the river Waihopai at the starting point.
