PROCLAMATION.

By his Honor JAMES EDMUND HODSON, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intitled "The Provincial Reserved Bills Act 1858," it is enacted that whenever any Bill shall have passed the Provincial Council of any Province, and shall have been reserved for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon, such Bill shall not have any force or authority within the said Province until the Superintendent shall signify either by speech or Message to the Provincial Council, or by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, that such Bill has been laid before the Governor, and that the Governor has assented to the same :

And whereas the following Bill, intitled

"The Public Cemeteries Acts Amendment Act, 1875"
was passed by the Provincial Council of

the Province of Marlborough, but was reserved for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon :

Now therefore, I, JAMES EDMUND HODSON, the Deputy Superintendent of the said Province of Marlborough, do hereby proclaim and declare, that the above-mentioned Bill having been duly laid before his Excellency the Governor, and the Governor having assented to the same, will, under the provisions of the said recited Act of the General Assembly, be in full force and authority within the said Province, upon the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province of Marlborough.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Marlborough, at Blenheim, this Thirtieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

REGULATIONS FOR ISSUING
TIMBER LICENSES.

THE following Regulations for the issue of Timber Licenses are published for general information:—

For Lands not under Pastoral Leases.

All applications for Timber Licenses shall be referred to the Waste Lands Board; and in all cases in which the Board shall decide to issue a License a fee of One Pound shall be charged, and if the License extends over an area of more than ten acres, it shall be put up to auction at such upset price as the Waste Lands Board shall determine.

Every application shall be accompanied by a deposit sufficient to cover expenses of survey.

A tithe of Sixpence per one hundred feet, measured in the log, shall be charged upon all timber cut down, whether used or not.

All rents shall be paid one year in advance, and shall be charged on the following scale, provided always that when the amount of tithes exceeds the rent, the rent shall be deducted; and when the amount of tithes is less than the rent, the rent only shall be charged:—

£15	for less than 60 acres
5s. per acre	from 60 to 100 "
4s. "	" " " 100 to 300 "
3s. "	" " " 300 to 500 "
2s 6d. "	500 and upwards.

No License shall be issued for more than one thousand acres, and the duration of a License shall be for such term as the Waste Lands Board may determine, not to exceed ten years.

For Lands under Pastoral Leases.

The holder of a Pastoral Lease may take out a License to cut and remove timber over the whole of his leasehold during the currency of his Lease, provided that it shall have not more than ten years to run, for which a fee of One Pound shall be charged.

The License shall provide for the payment of a tithe of Fourpence for every one hundred feet, measured in the log, upon all timber cut down, whether used or not; provided always that instead of paying such tithe, the holders of the License may elect to pay an acreage rent of One Pound per acre, in which case he must have a properly executed survey made, having the lines cut round the land over which the acreage rent is to be paid, and shall furnish the Commissioner of Crown Lands with a properly executed plan of such survey.

General Conditions.

All license-holders shall keep books with true and accurate accounts entered therein of all timber cut by them, and shall, during the first week in the months of January and July in each year, render to the Commissioner of Crown Lands a copy of such account, showing the transactions of the last six months, accompanied by a statutory declaration supporting its accuracy, and shall at the same time remit all money due as tithes, amounting to over and above the proportion of rent for the six months, and in the case of no timber having been cut shall send in a *nil* return.

If either the returns or remittances shall be two months in arrear, the License shall *ipso facto* be forfeited.

The holder of any Timber License shall, whenever required to do so by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or any person authorised by him in writing for that purpose, point out on the ground the boundaries of the land included in the License, and also the boundaries of the land upon or from which timber shall have been cut or removed by virtue of such License.
