JETTY AND WHARF ORDINANCE.

In the Seventeenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria.

SESSION I. No. 9.

ANALYSIS.

Preamble.

1. Dunedin Public Land Commissioners authorised to erect Jetties.
2. To levy Tolls for the use thereof.
3. And to make Bye-laws for regulating the use thereof.
4. Commencement.

An Ordinance to authorise the Erection and Maintenance, and to regulate the use of Public Jetties and Wharves.

WHEREAS it is expedient to authorise the Board of Commissioners for the Management of the Public Lands in Dunedin, constituted by an Ordinance passed in the present Session of the Provincial Council of Otago, intituled "An Ordinance for Protecting, Leasing, and improving the Lands in and about Dunedin reserved for Public Purposes, and Promoting those Purposes" (Session I. No. 5,) to erect and maintain Public Jetties, and to regulate and levy Rates for the use thereof:

Be it enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners constituted by the above-recited Ordinance to erect, extend, maintain, and repair Public

Jetties and Wharves, and all buildings and machinery necessary for the same.

2. Also to levy Tolls, Dues, and Wharfages, not exceeding the rates set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, unless by resolution of at least two-thirds of the said Commissioners the levying of other and higher rates shall have been authorised.

3. And further, to make such Rules and Bye-laws for the management of such Public Jetties and Wharves, and the approaches thereto, as a majority present at any lawful meeting of the said Commissioners shall see fit; and such Rules and Bye-laws shall be laid before the Superintendent of the Province, and being by him or an Council approved, and published in the Provincial Government Gazette, shall have the force of law.

4. This Ordinance shall come into operation from and after the day of the passing thereof.
