COPY of Opinion of the Attorney-  
General on the "Provincial Coun-  
cil Ordinance" passed at Otago:—  
The 10th section of the Provincial  
Councils Act, which professes to dis-

qualify certain persons for seats in the Provincial Council or the Superintendency, is, I think, simply void, and the Act need not be disallowed on account of it; but the Provincial Authorities should be cautioned not to attempt to enforce that section, and it would be well if it were repealed in the next session of the Council.
