PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM CARGILL,  
Esquire, Superintendent of the  
Province of Otago.

**WHEREAS** by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, entitled the "Roads' Ordinance, 1856," it is among other things enacted, Section 2, that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Board of Road Trustees, from time to time, by proclamation in the Government Gazette, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge, the boundaries of any or all of the Districts named in the Schedule to the said Ordinance, and to increase the number of Districts by forming and naming new Districts. And whereas it is necessary to alter the boundary of the District No. 6 of the said Schedule, called "East Taieri District," and form the same into two Districts, named and bounded as after-mentioned: Now, THEREFORE, I, the said Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Board of

Road Trustees, do hereby divide and proclaim the said District into two Districts, to be respectively named "North Taieri District," and "East Taieri District," and to be bounded as follows:—

NORTH TAIERI DISTRICT.

This District comprises the tract of country within the following boundaries—From a point on the Taieri River where the boundary or division line between river sections Nos. 40 and 41 extended would strike the said river; thence direct across a road line and following the division or boundary line referred to; thence to a road line forming the North-eastern boundary of said and other river sections; thence following the North-eastern boundary line of said section No. 40 to a point where a line running in a North-east direction, and dividing the sections in Blocks XIX., XII., XI., &c., East Taieri District, would strike the boundary line referred to of said section No. 40; thence across a road line direct to and following the said line running North-east and dividing in half

each of Blocks XIX., XII., XI., &c., already referred to across the road lines between said Blocks to the junction of the North-east boundary line of Sections Nos. 6 and 12, Block X., East Taieri District; thence along the North-east boundary line of Section No. 6, Block X, direct across a road line, and thence, following the North-east boundary line of Section No. 12, Block VI., to the line running North-east and dividing in half Blocks VI. and V.; thence along the said line direct across a road line to the North-east boundary line of Sections Nos. 2 and 8, Block V.; thence along the North-east boundary line of said sections Nos. 2 and 8, direct across a road line to the North-west point of section No. 7, Block I., and thence along the North-west boundary line of said section No. 7, and of irregular sections 45 and 46, to the North-east point of No. 46, and thence in a direct line to the South-west corner of Section No. 155, Wakari District; thence along the boundary of the Wakari Road District No. 2, to the Trigonometrical Station on Swampy Hill; thence the boundary of the East Taieri Hundred to the Taieri River; thence the said river to the point first mentioned.

#### EAST TAIERI DISTRICT.

This District comprises the tract of country within the following boundaries:—From the South-west corner of Section No. 155, Wakari District, along the boundary line of No. 2, Wakari District, and No. 5, Green Island District, to the Ocean; thence along the Coast line to the Taieri river; thence along said river to the boundary of the Northern part of the East Taieri District; thence along the said boundary line to the South-west corner of Section No. 155, Wakari District.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Honor WILLIAM CARGILL,  
Esquire, Superintendent of the  
Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of

Otago, intituled "An Ordinance to establish and regulate Ferries, Session I., No. 8," it is among other things enacted that "It shall be lawful for the Superintendent to authorise Ferries to be established and erected at convenient places on the rivers, creeks, and lakes within the Province of Otago, for the conveyance of passengers, animals, and goods across the same;" and whereas by section 3 of the "Ferries Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1856," passed by the said Superintendent and Council, it is enacted that "Every Ferry shall be deemed to be a Public Ferry within the meaning of this Ordinance, which shall be proclaimed to be such by the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, by proclamation to be inserted in the Provincial Government Gazette;" and whereas it is expedient that the Ferry established on the Taieri River at or near the West Taieri River Section No. 38, and known by the name of the Upper Taieri Ferry, should be proclaimed a Public Ferry. Now therefore I, the said Superintendent, with the advice and consent of my Executive Council, do hereby, in virtue of the powers vested in me by the said Ordinances, proclaim the said Ferry ~~called the Lower Taieri Ferry~~ to be a Public Ferry within the meaning of the before recited "Ferries Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1856."
