PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that there shall be, within the Colony of New Zealand, Courts of Record possessing Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction, to be called District Courts, and the Governor is empowered from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the "New Zealand Gazette," to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, Districts within which such Courts shall be respectively held, and such Districts to abolish, and the boundaries thereof to define or alter, and also to declare by what local name each such Court shall be designated.

Now, therefore I, the Governor, in pursuance and execution of the aforesaid au-

thority do hereby proclaim and constitute the Province of

OTAGO

to be a District within which a District Court shall be held under the said Act.

And in further pursuance and exercise of the authority aforesaid, I do hereby declare that the aforesaid Court shall be designated by the name of "The District Court of Otago."

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Colony, at Government House, at Auckland, in the Colony aforesaid, this 13th day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine.

Know YE, that We have assigned you, and each and every of you, jointly and severally to be our Justices of the Peace in the Province of Otago, in our Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, to keep and cause to be kept, all Laws, Ordinances, and Statutes, in force within the said Province for the punishing of offenders, the preservation of the peace, and for the quiet rule, welfare, and good government of Our People in the said Province; and to have, exercise, and discharge all the powers, authorities, and duties belonging or pertaining to the office of a Justice of the Peace in the said Province.

And therefore, We command you, and each of you, that to keep the Peace, and

all Laws, Ordinances, and Statutes, and all and singular other the Premises, you diligently apply yourselves, and that, at certain days and places duly appointed or to be appointed for these purposes, into the Premises to make enquiry, and all and singular the Premises hear and determine and perform and fulfil them, doing therein what to justice appertains according to the Law and Custom of England and of the said Province.

And we command all Our Sheriffs in the said Province, at certain days and places appointed or to be appointed, to be aiding by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the Premises.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these our Letters to be made Patent and the Seal of our Colony to be hereunto affixed.

first day of January last, on Pencarrow Head, at the entrance of Port Nicholson, (Wellington), Cook's Strait, New Zealand, will be a fixed Light, and *not subject* to eclipses at intervals of two minutes, as described in the following notice bearing date the 7th December 1858.

 PENCARROW LIGHTHOUSE.**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that on and after the First day of January next, a New Light will be exhibited on Pencarrow Head, at the entrance of Port Nicholson, (Wellington), Cook's Strait, New Zealand.

The New Light will be of the second order, (Catadioptric system) with eclipses at intervals of two minutes; it will be 420 feet above high water mark, and visible in ordinary weather at a distance of thirty English miles.

The following are the magnetic bearings and distances of the site of the new Lighthouse:—

- From Baring Head, N.W. by N., $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles.
 - From Sinclair Head, E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles.
 - From Outer Rock of Barrett's Reef, S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., 1 mile.
 - From Steeple Rock, S.S.E., 2 miles.
 - From Cape Campbell, N.N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., 33 miles.
- The Lighthouse is in Latitude $41^{\circ} 22' 0''$ S.
 Longitude $174^{\circ} 51' 15''$ E.
