PROCLAMATION

By his Honor JOHN LARKINS CHEESE
RICHARDSON, Esquire, Superintendent
of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the General Assembly of New Zealand, Session 4, intituled, "Superintendent's Deputy Act, 1856," it is among other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any Province, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* of such Province, to appoint such person as he may think fit, being a registered elector of such Province, to be his Deputy, and as such to perform and exercise all the acts and powers (except such powers as are conferred by the Constitution Act, 15 and 16 Vic., c. 72), which may be exercised and performed by such Superintendent; and the acts of such Deputy-Superintendent, so far as authorised by such Proclamation, shall be as effectual in all respects as if performed by the Superintendent himself: And whereas the said General Assembly is to assemble at Wellington upon the 30th day of June current, and I am about to proceed to Wellington for the purpose of attending as a Member thereof, and it is therefore necessary that I should appoint a registered elector to be my Deputy, to act during my absence as provided by the said recited Act;

Now, therefore, I, the said Superinten-

dent, do hereby proclaim that I have appointed, and do hereby appoint

The Honorable JOHN HYDE HARRIS,
Esquire,

A registered elector of the Province of Otago, to be my Deputy, and as such to perform and exercise, during my absence from the Province, all the acts and powers (except such powers as are conferred by the Constitution Act, 15 and 16 Vic. c. 72), which may be exercised and performed by me.

NOTICE.

UPPER TAIERI FERRY.

BY virtue of the powers in me vested by "The Ferries Ordinance, 1856," I, the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby give notice that, on and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two,

the authorised Fares chargeable at the West Taieri Ferry for persons, animals, carriages, and goods conveyed across the same, shall be as undermentioned, viz.— from sunrise till one hour after sunset:—

For each person	...	6d.
" " horse, mule, or ass, not drawing any carriage	...	1s.
" " head of great cattle	...	6d.
" " sheep, goat, and hog, when under 20	...	2d.
" " sheep, goat, and hog, when 20 and upwards	...	1d.
" " cart, dray, waggon, and carriage of what kind soever, exclusive of goods and passengers	...	1s.
" " horse, mule, ass, and bullock, drawing any cart, dray, waggon, or other carriage.	...	6d.
" " bale of wool...	...	6d.
Other Goods at the rate of 2d. per 100 lbs.		

From one hour after sunset till sunrise the above fares and freight and one-half more shall be charged.

Further, I hereby give notice, that the Mail, and persons exhibiting a certificate under the hand of the Superintendent, that they are on duty under the employ of the Government, are exempt from the payment of the said fares and freights.
