PROCLAMATION,

Extending to the Town of Port Chalmers the "Dunedin Roads and Streets Ordinance, 1861."

By the Honorable JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Esquire, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the "Dunedin Roads and Streets Ordinance, 1861," it is enacted that the said Ordinance may be put in force in any other Town in the Province of Otago, by Proclamation of the Superintendent, published in the *Provincial Government Gazette*: And whereas it is expedient that the said Ordinance should be extended to the Town of Port Chalmers: Now, therefore, I, the Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province, in virtue of the powers vested in me, do hereby proclaim that the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within the said Town of Port Chalmers, from and after the date hereof.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Otago, at Dunedin, the nineteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two.
