OF THE APPOINTMENT OF JUDGES OF  
THE WARDENS' COURTS IN THE SAID  
PROVINCE, UNDER AND BY VIRTUE OF  
"GOLD FIELDS ACT, 1858."

**W**HEREAS by Proclamation, given under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Otago, the 13th day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, I, John Larkins Cheese Richardson, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, on the recital and in pursuance and exercise of the powers delegated to me by the Governor of New Zealand therein set forth, constituted provisionally for certain parts or Districts therein mentioned of the Gold Field of the Province of Otago WARDENS' COURTS for the administration of Justice within the said Districts respectively: And whereas it is necessary that in further pursuance and exercise of the powers delegated to me as aforesaid, I should appoint Wardens or Judges of the Wardens' Courts of such Districts;

Now therefore I, John Larkins Cheese Richardson, Superintendent aforesaid, do

by this instrument, in pursuance and exercise of the power so delegated to me, appoint—

to be Wardens and Judges of the said Wardens' Court, with power to them and each of them to act alone or with Assessors or Juries, and in such manner and to exercise all or any of the powers in the Gold Fields Act, 1858, mentioned as the Governor shall think fit to direct, but declaring that such appointments shall be deemed to be provisional only until the same shall have been confirmed and allowed by the Governor, and that the Governor shall have power to disallow the same.

**LEASE OF HOTEL & FERRY, WEST  
TAIERI, TO EDWIN HOOPER.**

**T**HIS DEED made the fifteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two BETWEEN JOHN LARKINS CHEESE RICHARDSON Superintendent of the Province of Otago of the one part and EDWIN HOOPER of the same Province Hotelkeeper of the other part WITNESSETH that in consideration of the Rent hereinafter reserved and of the covenants on the part of the Lessee herein contained or implied the said John Larkins Cheese Richardson as Superintendent aforesaid doth hereby demise unto the said Edwin Hooper ALL that piece of Land containing two roods or thereabouts be the same more or less called an Hotel Reserve being part of Crown Lands contiguous to the Upper Taieri Ferry Reserve situate in the West Taieri District in the said Province bounded towards the north-west by Crown lands five hundred links towards the north-east by a Road line one hundred links towards the south-east by River Section numbered thirty-eight same District five hundred links and towards the south by Crown lands aforesaid one hundred links together with the Hotel or Inn thereon and all the appurtenances to the Premises belonging And also ALL that piece of Land containing nine acres three roods and thirty-nine poles or thereabouts be the same more or less situate and being in the Township of Outram in the said Province bounded towards the west by Beaumaris-street one thousand two hundred and forty-eight links towards the north-east by Bell street eight hundred and one links towards the south-east by River Section numbered thirty-five West Taieri District aforesaid and towards the south-west by Formby-street eight hundred and one links with all the appurtenances to the same belonging as the same pieces of land are respectively delineated on the plans drawn in the margin of these presents and colored red And also all that the Upper Taieri Ferry in connection with the said Reserve and the right to ply the same and the boats and all other gear and appurtenances belonging to the said Ferry To hold the premises hereby demised unto the said Edwin Hooper his executors and administrators excluding assigns from the day of the date of these presents for the term of one year yielding and paying therefor unto the said John Larkins Cheese Richardson as Superintendent aforesaid or his successors in office as and for the rent of the said Hotel the sum of two hundred and seventy-five pounds and as and for the rent of the said Ferry the sum of one hundred and eighty-one pounds five shillings making together the rent of four hundred and fifty-six pounds five shillings without any deduction and to be paid by equal quarterly payments on the fifteenth day of

December the fifteenth day of March the fifteenth day of June and the fifteenth day of September all now next ensuing AND the said Edwin Hooper doth hereby for himself his heirs executors and administrators covenant with the said John Larkins Cheese Richardson as Superintendent aforesaid and his successors as aforesaid that he the said Edwin Hooper his executors and administrators during the said term will pay all existing and future taxes rates charges and all other outgoings whatsoever payable whether by the Landlord or Tenant in respect of the demised premises including the expense of erecting and maintaining party fences And also will not assign this Lease or underlet or part with the possession of the said demised premises or any part thereof to any person or persons whomsoever and also will conduct the whole business of the said Ferry personally with such assistance as may be necessary for the efficient working of the same And also will ply the said Ferry at all hours unless when from the state of the weather or other cause the passage would be dangerous or impracticable And also will levy the following rates of Ferryage for the conveyance of persons carriages horses cattle sheep and goods and none other (except as hereinafter provided) that is to say for each horse mule or ass not drawing any carriage one shilling for each head of great cattle sixpence for each sheep goat and hog when under twenty twopence for each sheep goat and hog when twenty and upwards one penny for each cart dray waggon and carriage of what kind soever exclusive of goods and passengers one shilling for each horse mule ass and bullock drawing any cart dray waggon or other carriage sixpence for each bale of wool sixpence other goods at the rate of twopence per one hundred pounds weight and from one hour after sunset till sunrise the said rates of Ferryage respectively and one-half more shall be charged by the said Edwin Hooper his executors or administrators: PROVIDED always that the Mail and persons exhibiting a certificate under the hand of the Superintendent for the time being that such persons are on duty under the employment of Government shall be exempted from the payment of rates of Ferryage: And also shall and will keep a regular and daily account of all rates of Ferryage received by or due to him or them and transmit a copy thereof to the Superintendent for the time being at the end of every month certified by the said Edwin Hooper his executors or administrators to be a true account of the rates of Ferryage levied or that were leviable by him during each and every day of the month included in such account And also will observe any laws or Rules already passed or which shall be

hereafter made by the said Superintendent or his successors for securing the orderly conduct of the business of the said Hotel and Ferry to the satisfaction of the Government as respects charges and otherwise: Provided always that if any Laws or Rules be passed altering the fares of the said Ferry or in the event of a Bridge being put across the River before the expiry of this demise it shall be at the option of the said Edwin Hooper to relinquish this Lease at any time within one month from the passing of such Laws or Rules: And also at the expiration of the said term shall and will if required leave and deliver up to the Superintendent of the said Province for the time being the whole of the demised premises and hereditaments in a good and sufficient state of repair receiving valuation for improvements made during this demise in manner hereinafter mentioned And also will keep the said Hotel or Inn insured against loss or damage by fire in the name of the said Superintendent and his said successors in the sum of nine hundred pounds with some reputable Insurance Office approved of by the said Superintendent or his said successors: PROVIDED always that the said Edwin Hooper his executors or administrators shall not be bound under or by virtue of the covenant to yield up the premises in good and tenable repair as hereinbefore expressly provided to rebuild the said Hotel in the event of the destruction of the same by fire: And that in case the said Hotel shall be destroyed by fire or so damaged as to become untenable the said Superintendent or his said successors will with all convenient speed rebuild and replace the same: PROVIDED always and it is hereby declared and agreed by and between the said parties hereto that in case the said Hotel or Inn and Premises hereby demised or any part thereof shall at any time or times during the said term hereby granted be burnt down or damaged by fire so as to render the same uninhabitable then and in such case the rent of the said Hotel hereinbefore reserved shall in the event of the same being burnt down or a proportionate part of such rent in the event of a partial destruction thereof shall be suspended until the same shall be rebuilt and again rendered fit and proper for habitation: AND the said Superintendent doth hereby for himself in that behalf and his said successors covenant with the said Edwin Hooper his executors and administrators in manner following (that is to say) that he the said Edwin Hooper his executors or administrators duly paying the said rent and performing and observing the covenants and agreements on the part of the

Lessee reserved contained or implied by or in these presents shall and lawfully may peaceably and quietly hold and enjoy the said hereby demised premises during the said term hereby granted without any lawful let suit trouble hindrance or interruption whatsoever from or by him the said Superintendent or his said successors or any other person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim by from through under or in trust for him them or any of them And also that he the said Superintendent or his said successors shall within one calendar month after this demise allow and pay unto the said Edwin Hooper his executors or administrators a sum equal to the then value of any Buildings or improvements erected or made by the said Edwin Hooper his executors or administrators and then being upon the said demised premises with the previous written approval and sanction of the Superintendent for the time being: AND it is hereby agreed by the parties to these presents that the amount so payable shall be determined in case of doubt by the written award of two arbitrators one appointed by each party in difference or if such arbitrators fail to agree in an award within Twenty-one days after their appointment then by the written award of an umpire chosen by them before entering upon the reference and either party who after receiving written notice from the other party of the appointment of an arbitrator by the party so giving notice shall fail within Ten days to appoint his or their own arbitrator shall be deemed to have made default in appointing an arbitrator and the arbitrator of the party so giving notice may proceed alone and his award shall be conclusive and the costs of and attending such Reference and award shall be equally defrayed by the two parties in difference and this present agreement for arbitration may be made a Rule of any competent Court: PROVIDED always that if the Rent hereinbefore reserved or any part thereof shall be in arrear for Twenty-one days after any of the said days whereon the same ought to be paid as aforesaid although no formal demand shall have been made or upon breach non-observance or non-performance of any of the covenants by and on the part of the said Edwin Hooper his executors or administrators it shall be lawful for the said John Larkins Cheese Richardson as Superintendent and his successors as aforesaid to re-enter upon the demised premises and re-possess and hold the same as if this demise had not been made. IN WITNESS whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and Seals and the said John Larkins Cheese Richardson caused the Public Seal of the

said Province to be affixed hereto the day and year first above written.

#### PUBLIC NOTICE.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Provincial Legislature of the Province of Otago, intituled, an Ordinance for Promoting the Improvement of the City of Dunedin, it is among other things enacted:

Section 4—Immediately after the passing of this Ordinance, the Board shall divide the said City into Wards or Districts, and fix and determine the boundaries thereof; and it shall be lawful for the Board to alter, vary, add to, or diminish the boundaries and extent of the said Wards, or any of them, and to vary the number of the said Wards, in such manner as the state of the population thereof, or other circumstances, shall appear to them from time to time to require; and the boundaries of the Wards shall run along the middle of the streets by which they are declared to be bounded, except when the contrary is specially mentioned: Provided always that such Wards, and boundaries thereof, and any alterations thereon, shall be intimated by advertisement, to be made in the *Provincial Government Gazette* and in newspapers published in Dunedin.

And Whereas the Town Board of Dunedin have for the purposes of the said

recited Ordinance, determined to divide the City of Dunedin into four Wards, to be called respectively

South or No. 1 Ward,  
High or No. 2 Ward,  
Bell or No. 3 Ward,  
Leith or No. 4 Ward,

to be bounded as aftermentioned.

#### SOUTH WARD.

This Ward comprises all that portion of the City of Dunedin and Town Belt, bounded towards the north and north north-west by Jetty and Stafford-streets, and towards the south-west and south south-west by suburban lands.

#### HIGH WARD.

This Ward comprises all that portion of the City of Dunedin and Town Belt, bounded towards the north and north-east by Dowling-street to its junction with York Place, thence by York Place to northern Cemetery, thence by a line bearing west north-west to suburban lands, on the west south-west by suburban lands, and on the south south-west and south by South Ward.

#### BELL WARD.

This Ward comprises all that portion of the City of Dunedin and Town Belt, bounded towards the north north-east by Frederick-street, on the east north-east by Pitt-street, on the east south-east by Heriot Row to Section No. 51, Block 19, thence by a line bearing west north-west to suburban land towards the south-west and south south-west by High Ward.

#### LEITH WARD.

This Ward comprises all that portion of the City of Dunedin and Town Belt to the northward of Bell Ward.
