A PROCLAMATION

Constituting certain Public Gaols in the Province of Otago.

By His Excellency Sir **GEORGE GREY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS power is vested in the Governor of New Zealand by Proclamation to declare any House, Building, Enclosure, or Place to be a Public Gaol: Now, therefore, I Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid, do hereby declare and proclaim the places following, that is to say:—

1. The Government Hulk in the Port of Dunedin.
2. The Cell, enclosure, or compartment numbered two in the Lock-up or Watch-house at Tokomairiro.
3. The Cell, enclosure, or compartment numbered two in the Lock-up or Watch-house at the Dunstan Gold-field.
4. The Cell, enclosure, or compartment numbered two in the Lock-up or Watch-house at Port Chalmers, shall be and be used as Public Gaols.

Given under my hand at the Government House, at Auckland, and issued under the Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this twenty-second day of November, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two.

A PROCLAMATION

For the Naturalization of Carlos C. Cole.

By His Excellency Sir **GEORGE GREY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Naturalization Act, 1862," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor shall as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be and to have been from such specified time a natural born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes, as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed. Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation or calling, of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation.

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the person hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act, from the date hereinafter specified, viz:—

CARLOS COYDON CHARLES COLE,

From the thirtieth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one; Native of the United States, Coach Proprietor, residence Dunedin, in the Province of Otago.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

A PROCLAMATION

Constituting Hundreds in the Province of Otago.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the "Definition of Districts Act, 1858," that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to divide the Colony into Counties, Hundreds, and Parishes, or such other divisions as he may deem expedient, which shall have such limits, and shall have and be known by such names or designations as in and by the Proclamation constituting the same shall be prescribed; and also in like manner from time to time to alter and annul any such division, or the name or designation thereof:

And whereas by a Proclamation made by the Governor, and issued under the Seal of the Colony on the sixteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the several Hundreds therein particularly mentioned and described were constituted in the Province of Otago, and it is expedient to alter the Boundaries of such Hundreds, and to establish additional Hundreds in the said Province:

Now, therefore, I Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid, in pursuance and in exercise of the before recited authority, do hereby annul the several divisions set forth in the said Proclamation, and do hereby proclaim and declare that there shall be within the Province of Otago the several Hundreds bounded by the limits and known by the names or designations hereunder written, that is to say:—

Waikouaiti Hundred.

Forty Square Miles.

Comprises all that area bounded on the North by the Waikouaiti River; on the East by the ocean; on the South by Dunedin Hundred; and an East and West line (true bearing) drawn from Double Hill to the South arm of the Waikouaiti River; and on the West by the Waikouaiti River.

Hawkesbury Hundred.

One hundred and eleven Square Miles.

Comprises all that area bounded on the North by Shag River; on the East and South by the ocean; and on the West by

Oamaru Hundred.

One Hundred and Thirty-six Square Miles.

Comprises all that area bounded on the North by the Waitaki River; on the East by the ocean; on the South by the Otepopo Hundred; and on the West by a straight line drawn from the junction of the Kauroo River to the Waireka and Big Hill Creek junction, thence by the Big Hill Creek to Big Hill, thence by a North North-east and by East line (true bearing) to the Waitaki River.

Authorising additional Postal Regulation.

At the Government House, at Auckland, the first day of December, 1862.

Present:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN
COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the "New Zealand Post Office Act, 1858," power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make Rules and Regulations for the

managing of the several Post Offices of the said Colony; for the receiving, despatching, conveying and delivering of Letters, (including the imposition of Fees for Private Boxes and deliveries); for the detaining, opening and return, or other disposal of irregularly posted, unclaimed, and refused letters, or such as from any cause whatsoever cannot be delivered or forwarded, and the contents thereof respectively, and for the publication of the Lists of the same; for the making, custody, and sale of Postage Labels; for the receiving and paying of money in connection with the said Postal Service; and for the conduct of Post Officers; and any such Rules and Regulations at any time in force to alter, vary, or revoke: and, for the purpose of giving effect to the Rules and Regulations so to be made, further power is given to the Governor in Council by the said Act to impose any penalty not exceeding ten pounds for any one offence against such Rules and Regulations.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby make the following additional Post Office Regulation: and doth declare that the same shall be in force from and after the first day of January, 1863, and that in addition and without prejudice to the Regulations published in the *Government Gazette*, No. 9, dated the 6th February, 1862.

Newspapers for transmission within the Colony or for Overland Mails shall be posted in single numbers, so put up that the date of publication may be readily seen. Packages of Newspapers consisting of more than one number, shall be treated as Book Packets.
