PROCLAMATION

*Of Albert Ferry, at the junction of the Hawea and Wanaka with the Clutha.*

By his Honor JOHN LARKINS CHEESE RICHARDSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the "Ferries Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1856," passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, it is enacted that every Ferry shall be deemed to be a Public Ferry within the meaning of the said Ordinance, which shall be proclaimed to be such by the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, by Proclamation, to be inserted in the *Provincial Government Gazette*: And whereas it is expedient to establish a Ferry at the junction of the Wanaka and Hawea Streams with the Clutha River:

Now therefore, I, the said John Larkins Cheese Richardson, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do proclaim and declare the Ferry established at the junction of the Wanaka and Hawea

Streams with the Clutha River to be a Public Ferry, for the conveyance of passengers, animals, and goods across the Hawea and the Clutha respectively, and that the same shall be called

"ALBERT FERRY."

#### PROCLAMATION

*Portobello and Anderson's Bay Road Districts altered, and North-east Harbour District formed.*

By his Honor JOHN LARKINS CHEESE RICHARDSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled, the "Roads' Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1862," it is, among other things, enacted, Section 12, that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the General Road Board, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to alter, vary, diminish, or enlarge the boundaries of any or all of such Districts, and to increase the number of Districts by forming and naming new Districts, or by dividing any District into two or more Districts:

And whereas it is necessary to alter the boundaries of the Districts numbered 4 and 5 in the Schedule to the said Ordinance, called the Portobello and the Anderson's Bay Districts, so as to admit of the formation of a new District, named and bounded as after-mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, the said Superintendent, with the advice and consent of

the General Road Board, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Portobello District, and of the said Anderson's Bay District, shall henceforth be as hereinafter set forth; and that there shall be a new District to be named the "North-east Harbor District," and to be bounded as after-mentioned:

#### PORTOBELLO DISTRICT.

This District comprises all that area bounded on the north by the Harbor; on the east by the Maori Reserve; on the south by the Ocean; and on the west by the North-east Harbor District.

#### ANDERSON'S BAY DISTRICT

Comprises all that area bounded on the north by the Harbor; on the east by the western boundary lines of Blocks I., II., III., and VIII., Anderson's Bay District, and that line continued from Section 22, Block I., to the Ocean; on the south by the Ocean; and on the west by the Dunedin Town Belt, and that road running direct from near Hillside to the Ocean Beach.

#### NORTH-EAST HARBOR DISTRICT

Comprises all that area bounded on the north by a line drawn between Sections Nos. 12 and 13, Block VII., Portobello Bay District, thence through the Sugar Leaf Hill or Harbor Cone, and onwards to the line dividing Sections 5 and 6, Block III., Portobello Bay District, and thence by Hooper's Inlet and the Ocean; on the west by Anderson's Bay District.

#### PROCLAMATION

*Exempting from Mining Operations the Township of Lawrence, Tuapeka.*

By His Honor JOHN LARKINS CHEESE RICHARDSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of the "Gold Fields Act, 1858," it is enacted that nothing thereinbefore contained shall authorise any person to occupy any Crown Land which shall have been exempted by the Governor from the operations of mining, or which shall have been applied to any public use or purpose, or be lawfully and *bona fide* used as a garden or orchard: And whereas it is ex-

pedient to declare the ground occupied by the Township of Lawrence to be exempt from mining operations and occupation, as aftermentioned :

Now, therefore, I, John Larkins Cheese Richardson, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue of the powers delegated to and vested in me in that behalf by the Governor in Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the ground occupied by the Township of Lawrence, Tuapeka Gold Field, as described in the Schedule hereto, is and shall be exempted from the operations of mining, and from other occupation by all persons whomsoever, claiming in virtue of any provisions of the said Act.

#### SCHEDULE.

The following **BYE-LAWS** were also passed by the Wardens of the South Tokomairi and Waihola Hundreds:

1. No diseased cattle shall be depastured upon the Hundreds, and any person or persons who shall turn out or depasture any diseased beast shall forfeit and pay for every such offence, any sum not exceeding £5.

2. No entire animal over the age of six months, excepting horses, asses, or mules, and no horse, ass, or mule over the age of twelve months shall be depastured upon the Hundred without the consent, in writing of the Wardens, or a majority of them; and any person or persons who shall turn out or depasture any entire animal above

the age of six months without having previously obtained the consent, in writing, of the Wardens, or a majority of them, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

3. Whenever it shall appear to the Wardens, or a majority of them, that any beast of a dangerous or vicious character, or when from any other cause they shall deem it advisable to prohibit any specified beast from being depastured upon the Hundred, it shall be lawful for them, or a majority of them, to prohibit the depasturing of any such beast, and to give notice in writing of such prohibition to the owner, or person having charge of such beast, and if the same shall not be removed from the unfenced pasture lands of the Hundred within twenty-four hours, or such further time as may be stated in such notice, after the service of such notice, by delivery of the same personally, or by leaving the same at the usual place of residence of such owner, or person having charge of such beast, the owner or person having charge of such beast shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £5; or if any person, as aforesaid, after having received notice as aforesaid, shall turn out or depasture on the Hundred any prohibited beast he shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £5 for every such offence; or, in the event of the owner of any beast which the Wardens shall deem it advisable to prohibit from running upon the Hundred, being unknown to them, it shall be lawful for them to impound such beast, to be dealt with under the "Impounding Ordinance, 1862."

4. No sheep shall be depastured on the Hundred without the consent, in writing, of the Wardens, or a majority of them, and under such restrictions as they may deem it advisable to impose, and any person depasturing sheep on the unenclosed land within the Hundred, without such consent, as aforesaid, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5: Provided always that this Byelaw shall not be applicable to sheep, *bona fide* travelling through the Hundred, if the same shall travel at a rate of not less than five miles a day.

5. No unbranded cattle over the age of six months shall be depastured on the Hundred, and unbranded cattle above the age of six months found on the Hundred, may be impounded to be dealt with according to law.

6. All persons depasturing stock on the Hundred shall furnish to the Wardens a return, showing the number, age, sex, colour, description, and brands, of all and every beast depastured on the Hundred by each of them, or failing to make such

return as aforesaid, within twenty-four hours after turning out any such beast, or making a false return, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5.

7. The Wardens, or a majority of them, may at any time call upon the license holders, or any license holder, to make a return showing the number, description, sex, age, colour, and brands of stock depastured upon the Hundred belonging to them, him, or her, or in their, his, or her custody; and any license holder neglecting or refusing to make such return within one week after having been required by notice in writing to make such return, or making a false return, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

8. Any cattle not being the property of or in the custody of a license holder, or being the property, or in the custody of a license holder, but depastured on the Hundred in contravention of any Bye-laws duly passed, may be impounded, and the owner or custodian of such cattle may be proceeded against for trespass, and shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

[Nothing herein contained shall prejudice the right of the Waste Land Board, or the Commissioner of Crown Lands to proceed against such trespassers for the recovery of the penalty of £50 imposed by the 76th clause of the "Waste Lands Regulations" for the illegal occupation of Crown Lands.]

9. Any person who shall set fire to the herbage or grass upon the Crown Lands within the Hundred, without the consent, in writing, of the Wardens, or a majority of them, previously obtained, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5, but such consent of the Wardens will not protect any person from the consequence of any loss or damage which may be sustained by any person by reason of the carelessness with which such burning of the Hundred may be performed.

10. Any person disturbing or harrassing cattle depastured within the boundaries of the Hundred shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5, provided always that the holder of a depasturing license within the Hundred, or any person duly authorised in his behalf, may drive such cattle for the purpose of collecting such as may belong to him, and for the free and legitimate use of his right of pasturage within the Hundred, but in the event of its being necessary for such purpose, to drive any cattle belonging to any other person a greater distance than half a mile, the person so driving such cattle must take them

to the nearest available stockyard, and there separate his own from those of other persons, and return the latter to the place from which they were driven, and failing so to do, will be liable to the penalty of any sum not exceeding £5 for every such offence. Any person removing cattle beyond the boundary of the Hundred, other than those belonging to him, or for the removal of which he shall have due authority, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

11. All, or any of the acts authorised by these Bye-laws, to be done by the Wardens, or a majority of them, may be done by any ranger or other person duly appointed by them, or authorised in that behalf.
