PROCLAMATION.

Cancellation of License to depasture Stock on certain Waste Lands of the Crown.

By the Honorable JOHN HYDE HARRIS,
Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the "Gold Fields Act, 1862," it is enacted that where any Gold Mine or Gold Field shall be discovered and proclaimed upon any Crown Lands held under license or lease for depasturing purposes, it shall be lawful for the Governor at his discretion to cancel the license or lease under which such land shall have been held in occupation as regards the whole or any part of the lands so held under such license or lease. And whereas by the said Act it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the public seal of the Colony, from time to time, to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections XIX, XXXI, XXXII, XXXIII, and LXI thereof, subject or not to any limitation as he may seem fit. And whereas by warrant under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and

Commander-in-Chief over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, dated at the Government House at Auckland on the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and issued under the public seal of the said Colony, His Excellency, by and with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, and in exercise of the power and authority for that purpose in him vested, did delegate absolutely and without restriction, unto me, John Hyde Harris, as Superintendent of the Province of Otago, all the powers vested by the "Gold Fields Act, 1862" in him and his Council, except the powers contained in sections XIX, XXXI, XXXII, XXXIII, and LXI of the said Act, to have, hold, and exercise, within the said Province of Otago, the powers by the said Act given. And whereas on the fifteenth day of September last, I, John Hyde Harris, in execution of the powers in me vested in that behalf, did, by proclamation in the Provincial Government Gazette, constitute and appoint a certain portion of the Province of Otago to be a Gold Field, under the provisions of the "Gold Field Act, 1862," under the name of the Wakatipu Gold Field, and the limits of which Gold Field I did, by the said Proclamation, define. And whereas a certain block or section of land, containing about one hundred thousand (100,000) acres by estimation, and bounded towards the east by Run No. 340, situate within the said Province of Otago, and now or

lately occupied by Messrs. Grant and Gammie for depasturing purposes under a license numbered 356, are within the limits of the said Gold Field. And whereas I, under the powers in that behalf vested in me, have determined to cancel the said license as to the whole of the land held under the said license, the admeasurement of which is estimated to be about one hundred thousand acres. Now, therefore, I, John Hyde Harris, the Superintendent of the said Province, do hereby, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me as aforesaid, declare the said license, numbered 356, to be cancelled over all Crown Lands held and occupied thereunder, estimated to be about one hundred thousand acres, bounded, as hereinbefore mentioned, towards the east by Run No. 340.

PROCLAMATION

OF WEST TAIERI GOLD FIELD.

I, JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested in this behalf, constitute and appoint to be a Gold Field, under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act, 1862," under the name of the

WEST TAIERI GOLD FIELD,

all that territory comprised within the area bounded towards the north by the Mount Ida Gold Field; towards the east by the Watershed of the Waikouaiti Downs and Silver Peak Mountains, thence by Silver Stream to the North Taieri Road; towards the south by the North Taieri Road, exclusive of the township of Outram; thence by the boundary of the West Taieri Hundred to Maungatua; thence by the boundary of the Tuapeka Gold Field to Lammerlaw, and thence towards the west by the Watershed of Rough Ridge to the North Rough Ridge Hill: And I declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the day of the date hereof.

PROCLAMATION.

Agricultural Leases on the Gold Fields.

Clauses, Provisos, and Conditions to be contained in Agricultural Leases under "Gold Fields Act, 1862."

By the Honorable JOHN HYDE HARRIS,
Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

I, JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested in this behalf, Proclaim and Declare the clauses, provisos, and conditions following, as applicable to any agricultural leases hereafter granted by me under the several provisions of the "Gold Fields Act, 1862," relating thereto.

1st. Agricultural Leases will be granted for a term not exceeding seven years.

2nd. Agricultural Leases will not be transferable without the special sanction and authority of His Honor the Superintendent, and for every such transfer a fee or fine of one pound (£1) will be charged.

3rd. The Government reserves to itself the right to survey, through any land held under an Agricultural Lease, such roads as may be deemed essential for public convenience, and to throw them open to public traffic, subject to the allowance of valuation for improvements, and for any standing and growing crops which may be in or upon such line of road, at the period when possession thereof is taken by the Government.

4th. The rent charged shall be at the rate of five shillings (5s.) per acre, payable yearly in advance from the date of application; and any fractional part of an acre will be considered as an acre and charged accordingly.

5th. The Government reserves to itself the right of entering upon any land so leased as aforesaid, for the purpose of searching for gold, or any other metal or mineral, and of determining any lease when such metals or minerals shall have been discovered thereon.

6th. In the event of the determination of any Agricultural Lease on account of the highly auriferous nature of the land thereby demised, the amount of compensation adjudged to be paid to the holder thereof shall (except in special cases) be contributed by the persons desirous of mining thereon.

7th. The fees charged for survey will be as follows:—

For an ordinary survey, when the area does not exceed four (4) acres, one pound.

For any larger area at the rate of five shillings per acre, or any portion of an acre.

And thirty shillings per diem extra when the time occupied in such survey extends beyond one day.

8th. Leases will be cancelled if the land is sublet or transferred without the sanction and authority of His Honor the Superintendent; or if cultivation is not commenced within three months after the issue of the lease; or if at any time during the currency of the lease the land shall be neglected for a period of six months.

NOTICE.

Agricultural Leases on Gold Fields.

NOTICE is hereby given, that His Honor John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, acting under the powers in that behalf vested in him by delegation from His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, will on and after the date hereof receive applications from persons desirous of leasing land for agricultural purposes, within those parts and portions of the Tuapeka, Dunstan, and Wakatipu Gold-fields, as hereinafter described, that is to say—

TUAPEKA GOLD-FIELD.

All the Crown Lands formerly known as Runs Nos. 53 and 54, situated within the Mining Districts of Gabriel's and Waitahuna, and being a part of the Tuapeka Gold-field, which lands are bounded on the north-west by the Tuapeka River; on the north and north-east by the boundary of Run No. 52; on the east by the west branch of the Tokomairiro River; on the south-east by the boundary of the Tokomairiro Hundred; and on the south-west by the boundary of the Tuapeka Gold-field.

DUNSTAN GOLD-FIELD.

All those Crown Lands estimated to be twelve thousand and five acres, lying within the area bounded on the north by the Leaning Rock Creek; on the east by the eastern terraces of the Wai Keri Keri Creek, to its junction with the Waipuna

Creek, thence by the Wai Keri Keri Creek to the River Clutha; and on the west by the River Clutha; and lately held with other lands, for depasturing purposes, by Watson Shennan, under License No. 221, and situate within the Dunstan Gold-field.

WAKATIPU GOLD-FIELD.

All that Block or Section of Land, being Run No. 356, lately occupied by Messrs. Grant and Gammie, and containing about one hundred thousand acres by estimation, and situated within the several mining districts of the Wakatipu Gold-field.

Persons applying for Agricultural Leases must strictly observe the following Regulations:—

1st. Leases will be granted for a term not exceeding seven (7) years, in accordance with the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act, 1862."

2nd. Every application for an Agricultural Lease must be made (in the form of the Schedule hereunto annexed, or to the like effect) to the Warden of the District wherein the Land is situate, and must be accompanied by a deposit of five pounds (£5), to cover the costs of survey. The balance, if any, of such deposit will be returned after the application has been finally dealt with.

3rd. The boundaries of the area applied for must be marked out on the ground by _____ trenches, and substantial posts at each corner thereof.

4th. Every such area must be rectangular in form, unless a creek or river, or other natural obstacle renders a deviation from the rectangular form necessary.

5th. As soon as possible after the receipt of any application and deposit as aforesaid, the Warden will instruct a Surveyor to proceed to the ground for the purpose of examining, surveying, and reporting upon the same.

6th. Agricultural Leases will not be granted for lands within the boundaries of proclaimed Townships or public reserves, nor for any area including a permanent water-course, or which may present auriferous indications upon survey; and in all cases a public roadway, one chain in width, will be reserved along the margins of streams and rivers.

Admitting Cattle into the Province of Otago from a portion of the County of Mornington in the Colony of Victoria.

By the Honorable JOHN HYDE HARRIS,
Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

I, JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby Proclaim and Declare that from and after the date hereof, until further notice, that portion of the County of Mornington, in the Colony of Victoria, hereinafter described, shall not be deemed an infected district within the meaning and for the purposes of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861." And that I do hereby rescind the Proclamation of the Superintendent of the Province of Otago bearing date the fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, so far as the same relates to the before-mentioned portion of the Colony of Victoria, that is to say,—All that area commencing at the mouth of a creek in Western Port Bay, said creek forming part of the west side of portion 2, parish of Yallock; thence by that creek northerly to the south side of the Koo-we-Rup Swamp; by that side of the swamp and a line north-easterly to a point on the Buneep Creek, seven miles south of the south boundary of the village of Buneep; thence southerly by part of the east boundary of the County of Mornington to Cape Paterson; thence westerly and northerly by the sea coast and the shores of Western Port Bay to the point of commencement, including likewise Phillip and French Islands.

STUART STREET JETTY DUES.

NOTICE is hereby given that I, the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue of the powers in me vested by the "Jetties and Wharves Ordinance, 1858," do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, give notice that on and after the sixteenth day of November, 1863, dues at the rate of one shilling and threepence per ton, and no other dues, tolls, and wharfages shall be levied, for the use of the Stuart-street Jetty, Dunedin.

Such Jetty Dues shall be paid by the Master or person in charge of each ship, vessel, or boat, before loading or unloading cargo, as the case may be, and shall be charged upon the vessel carrying the same, at the rate of one shilling and threepence per ton upon her registered tonnage; provided always that in the event of any vessel not having cargo amounting to one half of her registered tonnage, such dues may be charged, at the discretion of the Jetty-keeper, upon the actual quantity of goods she may have on board at the time of her arrival at the Jetty, or before her departure, in case of loading.

Vessels under 40 tons register shall be allowed four, and vessels above that tonnage shall be allowed six, working days to load and unload at the Jetty, as the case may be; but any vessel remaining at the Jetty longer, shall be charged 10s. per day for each day or part of a day.

Goods left on the Jetty, or its approaches, for more than 24 hours, shall be charged in addition to the rates before mentioned, at the rate of 1s. per ton per diem for every working day or part of a day they may be so left.

Any person refusing or delaying to pay, or attempting in any way to evade the payment, of any of the above tolls, dues, and wharfages, shall be charged double the said rates.
