NEW ZEALAND INDUSTRIAL EXHIBITION, 1863.

WHEREAS by Letters Patent under the hand of his Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, and the seal of the Colony, a Commission has been appointed for the purpose of devising and carrying out an Exhibition of Agricultural and Industrial Products, and Manufactures of the Colony of New Zealand, and such products and manufactures of other Countries as may be calculated to be useful in the development of the said Colony. And whereas by the aforesaid Letters Patent, authority is given to the Superintendents respectively of the Provinces of the said Colony to appoint in the several Provinces Local Committees, for the purpose of encouraging the production of articles to be exhibited, of transmitting them to Dunedin, and of conducting communication between Exhibitors and the Commissioners. PROCLAMATION,

Extending to certain Towns in the Province of Otago certain provisions of the "Town and Country Police Ordinance, 1862."

By the Honorable JOHN HYDE HARRIS,
 Superintendent of the said Province.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the provisions contained in sections numbered 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10, of an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Otago, intituled the "Town and Country Police Ordinance, 1862," should be extended to and be in force in the Towns of Dunedin, Port Chalmers, Oamaru, Hampden, Havelock, Molyneux, Outram, Clyde, Cromwell, Frankton, Queenstown, and Kingston:

Now therefore, I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the sections numbered 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10, of the "Town and Country Police Ordinance, 1862," shall be, from the day of the date hereof, extended to and be in force in the towns of

Dunedin	Port Chalmers
Oamaru	Hampden
Havelock	Molyneux
Outram	Clyde
Cromwell	Frankton
Queenstown	Kingston.

And I do declare that from the day of the date hereof the said Towns shall come under the operation of the whole of the

said sections 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10, of the said Ordinance.

REGULATIONS

Under "Waterman's Licensing Ordinance, 1863," for the Lake Wakatipu.

1. No person licensed under the "Watermen's Licensing Ordinance, 1863," shall use any rowing or sailing boat on the Lake Wakatipu, for the carriage or conveyance of passengers or goods, unless such boat has been first approved of in writing by the person authorised to grant licenses in the Wakatipu District; and if any such licensed person shall be found using, or shall be employed as hired servant, in any such boat, for such purpose, he shall be liable to a penalty of Forty Shillings, and his license may be forfeited in the discretion of the person before whom the penalty shall be recovered.
2. The person authorised to grant licenses in the Wakatipu District may, if he think fit, withdraw his written approval of any such boat if he shall at any time afterwards, upon examination, find the boat is not in good condition, and in every way fit and safe for the carriage of passengers and goods.
3. The person authorised to grant licenses in the Wakatipu District, shall keep a register of all rowing and sailing boats, approved of by him and shall in such register and in such written approval enter the tonnage of such sailing vessels.
4. All boats to be employed in carrying goods or passengers to any distance beyond half a mile from the shore of the Lake, or from any landing place on the Lake, shall be decked, and of not less than five tons according to the register kept by such authorised person as aforesaid, and if any person shall carry for hire cargo or passengers in a boat not decked, or of less tonnage than five tons, to a greater distance than half a mile from the shore, or from any such landing place, such person shall be liable to a penalty of Forty Shillings.
5. All boats carrying goods or passengers on the said Lake, to be allowed to carry three passengers for every ton, when such space is not occupied with cargo, the

tonnage of every vessel to be deemed and taken to be that entered in the register of such authorised person as aforesaid.

6. If such boat shall at any time have on board a greater number of passengers than the number allowed by the 5th Regulation, the boatman or boatmen using or having the charge thereof, shall forfeit and pay a penalty of Forty Shillings.

7. The license to ply for hire shall be granted annually, and no person shall receive any such license, until he has been examined by the person authorised to grant licenses for the Wakatipu District, and shall have obtained a certificate from such examiner, that he thoroughly understands the management of a boat. Provided that such authorised person instead of himself examining such person, may require him to produce a certificate of competency from the Harbor Master or Deputy-Harbor Master of the Port of Otago.

8. The license to be granted shall be in the form in the Schedule A to these Regulations, and before the same shall be granted, there shall be paid a fee of Five Shillings for the same, to such authorised person as aforesaid.

9. Every licensed boatman shall have the name and number of his boat legibly painted on the inside of the sternsheets of such boat, or on the after part of the combings of the main hatch of a sailing vessel, decked, under a penalty of Forty Shillings.

10. No boats whatever are to be made fast to any steps or landing place, or to be kept longer at such landing place or steps, than required for landing their passengers or goods, under a penalty of Forty Shillings.

SHEEP AND CATTLE RETURNS.

HIS Honor the Superintendent directs the publication of the following Report and Returns, shewing the number and condition of the Sheep of the Province of Otago, and the number of Cattle imported, during the year ended 30th September, 1863.

REPORT.

Dunedin, December 15th, 1863.

SIR—I have the honor to forward you the Annual Return of Sheep within the Province of Otago, for September, 1863.

You will observe by the enclosed list that the total number is nine hundred and eighty thousand eight hundred and sixty-one (980,861), which consists of 829,891 ewes, and 150,970 wethers, exclusive of lambs.

One hundred and thirty-two thousand and thirty-four (132,034) Sheep have been brought into the Province since September 1862. Landed at Port Chalmers, 54,225, principally fat. From Canterbury, 60,809 wethers and 5,000 ewes; and Southland, 12,000, mixed.

By the courtesy of the Settlers I am enabled to give a very close approximation

of the consumption of mutton in the country. I find by the Returns sent me, that 138 Settlers (Sheep Farmers) in the Province kill, in twelve months, for the use of their stations, thirty thousand (30,000) sheep; and have sold, as fat, one hundred thousand (100,000), chiefly for meat to the digging population, and thirty-five thousand (35,000) slaughtered for Dunedin and Suburbs, which is a much smaller number than is required, but I make an allowance for a part of the 100,000 sold as fat, finding their way to town. It will be seen that we require about 165,000 Fat Sheep a year for our use.

There is not the slightest fear of there being a scarcity of mutton in the Province, although I question the price being very much reduced.

To meet the above-mentioned demand we have one hundred and fifty thousand nine hundred and seventy (150,970) wethers, which will be marketable through the year; also a large number of old and coarse ewes, that will be drafted for meat to improve the flocks. And the importations will be much larger this season than we have ever had before.

The wet weather has kept the shearing a little back, but, as a whole, the Settlers have every reason to be satisfied, for one of the finest years they have had for stock since the commencement of the Settlement. The grass is abundant, and wanting for want of animals to eat it. The shearing will be a good average, and the lambing one of the best they have had for years—I believe something over 80 per cent.

The number of Sheep diseased, 60,350, shewn in the Returns, appear to be large; but with the exception of three stations, about 30,000, the others are completely under, only waiting for time to elapse to prove whether they are free from disease or not.

I have been fortunate enough to get 76,500 scabby Sheep cleaned within the last twelve months,—40,000 in the Molyneux District, under the charge of the Gold-fields Inspector; 24,000 Northern Inspector; and 12,000 Southern Inspector.

I also have the honor to hand you a Return of the number of Cattle imported into the Province of Otago, for the year ending 30th September, 1863.

LIGHTS, BEACONS, AND BUOYS IN VICTORIA.

THE following Notice to Mariners, relative to certain Lights, Beacons, and Buoys in Victoria, is published for general information. The present notice will affect to a certain extent the notices to mariners which were inserted in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th January, 1861, and of the 3rd February, 1863, pages 76 and 287.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

The various changes and alterations herein mentioned will come into operation on or about the first day of January, 1864:—

CAPE SCHANK LIGHTHOUSE.

Notice is hereby given that with the view of enabling navigators to see the Cape Schank Lighthouse better during thick or hazy weather, the tower will, on or about the above date, be painted *white* instead of *red*.

POINT LONSDALE LIGHTHOUSE AND RED BEACON.

Notice is also given that the light and look-out house on Point Lonsdale will, on or about the above date, be painted *red and black* in alternate horizontal bands, each ten (10) feet deep, commencing at the top with red.

The above-mentioned lighthouse having been built close to and on the same line of bearing as the Point Lonsdale red ball beacon, hitherto used as a thwart mark for clearing the Lonsdale and Lightning Rocks, the beacon will, on and after the

afore-mentioned date, be removed, and the lighthouse used for the mark instead.

POPE'S EYE SHOAL BUOY.

On or about the afore-mentioned date, the Pope's Eye Buoy will be removed altogether, and the North Buoy shifted from its present position, about two cables' length in a S.W. by S. direction.

SOUTH CHANNEL BUOYS.

The western Black Perch Buoy, No. I in the South Channel, will be shifted in a westerly direction from its present position to the tail of the south-west spit at the southern entrance to Symond's Channel, and replaced by a third-class buoy.

PRINCE GEORGE BANK BUOY.

The Red Cone Buoy on Prince George's Bank, moored about N. by W. from the West Channel Lightship, will be painted black instead of red, its present color.

POINT COOK BUOY.

A Black Cone-shaped Buoy has been placed off Point Cook, in five fathoms, with the following bearings:—
